Hit-and-run driver wanted

The Halton Regional Police Traffic investigators and Halton Crime Stoppers are seeking information about a hit and run accident which has left a 71 year old woman in hospital with serious injuries.

On Friday, Jan. 31, at approximately 6:50 pm, the victim was crossing Confederation Street in Glen Williams, Halton Hills, when she was struck by a vehicle which was travelling north bound. The vehicle continued north after striking the victim and passed through the intersection at Main Street, failing to stop for the stop sign. The vehicle had been travelling with no headlights and at an excessive speed for the area.

The vehicle is described as medium to dark colour, mid to full size, square tail lights, older boxy model, believed to have damage to the left front corner and possibly to the windshield.

Woman injured — man faces assault charges

A Milton woman's head bled after being punched several times by a man early Saturday morning.

A 29-year-old suspect has been charged with assault in connection with the beating which occurred at the 30-year-old victim's Pearl Street home.

Police say the woman returned home from the Royal Canadian Legion on Charles Street with a Milton man at about 2:30 a.m. The couple started arguing and the woman was punched repeatedly in the face.

Jewellery lost

The owner of a Dodge Caravan claims to have lost \$100,000 worth of jewellery after thieves broke into her car at Glen Eden Ski Area Thursday.

The jewellery which she left in her purse included an engagement ring and gold necklace, the woman told police. Her vehicle was parked in the west lot of the popular ski facility.

Two other car break-ins occurred in the lot Thursday at around the same time, between 10:45 and 11:15 a.m., police say. Thieves collected about \$600 cash.

Shoplifting

Two Acton teenagers face shoplifting charges after allegedly stealing condoms as well as other items from Shopper's Drug Mart at Milton Mall Friday.





Keep your distance from fallen



Ice storms, high winds, falling tree limbs can bring hydro lines down. Don't go near à fallen wire. even a seemingly dead line can be dangerous. Warn others to keep clear and call (your hydro) to report the fallen wire. If the line falls across your vehicle, stay inside until the line is removed by a hydro crew. If you must leave because of fire, jump clear without touching the car and the ground at the same time. If there's a live power line touching your car, putting even one foot on the ground can be a fatal move to make.
