All three Milton high schools placed in the team top 10 at the Halton high school alpine ski championship Wednesday at Kelso.

Led by the gold medal performances of Natalie Clarke and Jason Penman, Milton District High School finished second overall to Oakville Trafalgar. Penman led the boys team to a first place finish and Clarke led the girls to fourth. E.C. Drury High School finished sixth in the combined while Bishop Reding ended 10th.

Penman finished the course in 16.71 seconds, more than a quarter of a second ahead of second place Dan Antonios of Burlington's Lester B. Pearson High School. Clarke rocketed to almost a full second victory over Rochelle Cervais of Loyola (Oakville). Clarke finished in 19.73 seconds.

Besides Penman, the only other top 10 finish among Milton area boys was Milton District's John Stetic who tied for fourth with Tim Sheir of Georgetown. Michelle Orohovosck of E.C. Drury finished sixth among the girls and Maria Frederikson, also of E.C. Drury, was 10th.

Milton schools finished three, four, five in the girls team standings with Milton District sandwiched between E.C. Drury in third and Bishop Reding in fifth. Milton District topped the boys team standings and Bishop Reding was 10th. Oakville Trafalgar won their fourth Halton title in five years.

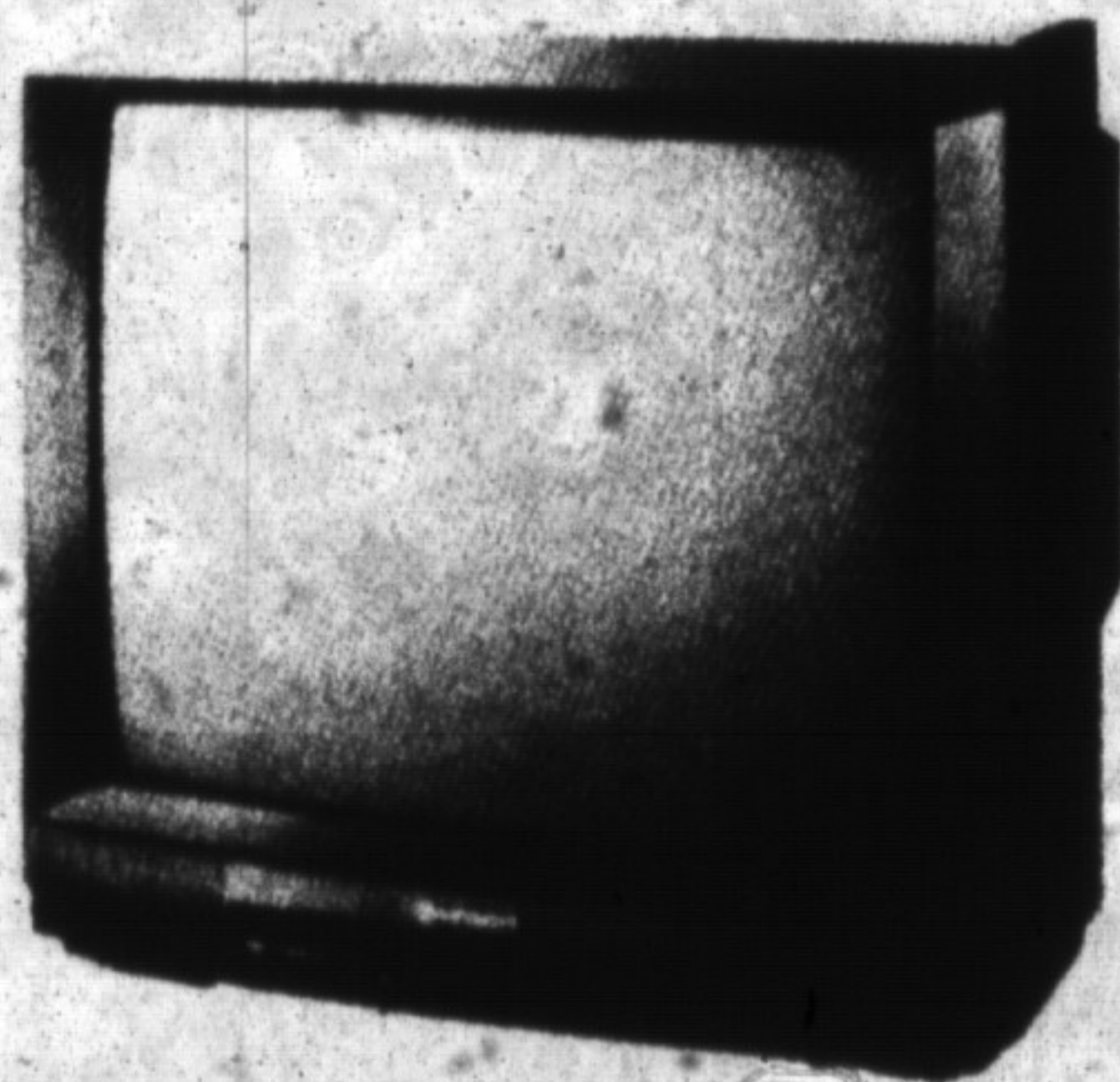
