# Jelinek stirs crowd with emotional plea

"We don't mind taking the bumps for tough decisions made in the past. This budget builds on programs already in place. But this snivelling and whining has got to stop. We've got to pull together," charged Mr. Jelinek.  
The MP noted other governments should look to the example set by the Tory federal government. Spending your way out of a recession doesn't work, he insisted.  
"There are no quick fixes," he said. "Governments don't create jobs, they never have. The private sector creates jobs. Government creates incentives for the private sector to do that."  
Mr. Jelinek said Tuesday's federal budget was good news for

Canadians.  
"When's the last time you've seen a budget with no tax increases?" he asked.  
Jelinek said the first budget prepared by Finance Minister Don Mazankowski was the pay off for the past six years of unpopular decisions made by the Tory government.  
"Needless to say, I think the fundamental structural changes the government's been making and the tough decisions the government's been making over the last six years is finally paying off," said Mr. Jelinek.  
The Minister of National Revenue said the budget helps those Canadians who need it most.  
"Because of the foundation we've built at the expense of political sup-

port, we've been able to do what most Canadians want," he said highlighting cuts in government spending, reduced government size and tax cuts present in the budget.  
Among the benefits announced in Tuesday's federal budget are:  
□ No tax increases.  
□ There will be a 1 per cent cut from the 5 per cent general personal surtax level to four per cent July 1 and a further drop to three per cent in 1993.  
□ A child tax benefit will replace all other child benefits in 1993. Children under 18 are eligible for up to \$144 per month, depending on family income.  
□ Child care expense deductions will go up by \$1,000 in 1993 to \$5,000 for children under seven years, and to \$3,000 for other children.

□ Homebuyers can each borrow up to \$20,000 from their RRSPs this year only, for repayment in 15 years. The one-shot deal must, however, see the RRSP funds become available this year.  
□ Small businesses can get emergency loans for larger amounts at lower interest rates.  
□ The manufacturing tax will be cut to 22 per cent from 23 per cent in 1993.  
□ Manufacturers allowed to write-off new machinery costs at an annual 30 per cent rate instead of 25 per cent.  
Cuts include:  
□ The Prime Minister and cabinet ministers take five per cent pay cuts.  
□ MPs, senators and senior bureaucrats get no more first class air travel, luxury hotels and fewer trips abroad.
