Winter sports wind down

Reding's Royals began their winter sport wind down recently as the junior boys basketball team continued their solid play with a 58-41 win over E.C. Drury. The Royals took early control over the game and finished victorious with Peter Stelter leading the way with 24 points.

Then the senior boys took to the court against Loyola (Oakville) in an attempt to secure a playoff spot. It was a seesaw game, the whole way with the Royals coming up short in the last 30 seconds losing 50-47. Matt Parent led the way with 11 for Reding while Todd Fuller, John Shaw and Jesse Ogden all hit for 10.

Overall the team had a good season led by veterans Dan Fratnik, Sean Proctor and Shaw all of whom played their final game of their high school career.

Also, the junior girls volleyball team participated in playoff preliminaries against Milton District. With the momentum swinging like a pendulum the lady Royals proved their abilities taking a 3-2 win in the best of five match 15-11, 14-16, 15-1, 13-15 and 15-7.

The next day Reding took on Acton with the junior and midget teams on display. The Reding juniors won easily 78-21 behind David Jackman's 16 points and Andy Wyman's 12 while the midget Royals claimed a 74-39 win with Mason Clausen and Neil Bagley both with 12 points.

The Royal winning streak continued when the senior girls volleyball team hosted and bested Oakville Trafalgar in the quarterfinals.
