"The alarm is not necessarily just for people being attacked," says E.C. Drury's Kate Vouk, "it attracts people to an emergency situation, like snow skiing accidents."

Of course one of the more serious advantages of the PAAL is it could deter attackers. The selling and promoting of these alarms has made the students "think about their safety" said Ms. Vouk. "They not only think of their own safety, but also the members of their families."

The Grade 11 retailing class intends to donate all proceeds to the schools improvement fund. This fund is set up so that groups or clubs. in the school can apply for funding for events, and special purchases. The improvement fund in the past has subsidized uniforms, band instruments, and any other improvments voted by the student body.
