Farm not the site of new Chudleigh's bakery

Chudleigh's kitchen has returned to Milton, but it will no longer be located at the famous Highway 25 apple farm.

A McGeachie Drive facility is the new home of Chudleigh Apple Farm's baking facility which annually produces thousands of pies and other baked goods with nature's toothbrush.

Although owner Tom Chudleigh has applied to the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) to rebuild a 12,000-square-foot kitchen on his farm site, he says the new industrial park facility is likely here to stay.

He admits he doubts the protective NEC will approve his proposal to build a bakery double the size of his previous 6,000-square-foot site destroyed in a devastating blaze more than two years ago.

In February, 1990, Mr. Chudleigh and his apple empire built over 27 years faced a serious setback when fire ripped through the 100-year-old barn and playbarn killing a sheep, goat, and three geese.

The only positive note was that none of the 25 employees in the buildings when the fire started were injured and the 72-acre apple orchard was not damaged.

The main barn housed a gift shop, country restaurant, and baking facilities.

Fire officials believe the blaze apparently started in a long shed which housed farm animals and equipment.

At first, the kitchen in the farm residence — the only building saved — was being used as a temporary pie bakery while Mr. Chudleigh and his wife Carol made plans to rebuild the business.

Sales of pies, apples and cider were made from tents set up on the farm and a short time later,

production was moved to a larger baking chamber in Aberfoyle, which up until this month, was the business's main output facility.

The new Milton facility is more convenient and less expensive to operate, says Shirley Rosenbersky, the farm's marketing director. She explains providing transportation for its employees will now be more economical.

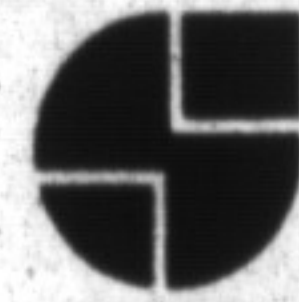
"We're very happy to be back in Milton and close to the labour source," says Mr. Chudleigh.

While the kitchen's location has changed, the famous Chudleigh pie recipe remains the same, Ms Rosenbersky adds.

"We haven't changed the pie since the first day Carol Chudleigh made it."

A new flavour of pie has arrived on the Chudleigh market, though — rhubarb crumble.

Since the fire, a new retail barn for Chudleigh's produce has opened on the farm. A children's play area and farm animals have also returned.
