## Former NHL official John McCauley honoured by Monarch Basketball

In late February Pat Gleeson, president of Milton's Monarch Basketball, presented the Halton Roman Catholic School Board with a financial donation in honour of John McCauley, former NHL director of officials, who died in June, 1989.

The annual contribution will cover the costs of carded referees for the semifinal and final games of the boys and girls school board basketball championships.

Gleeson noted that the objective of the gift was two-fold. It is intended to serve as a tribute to McCauley and will recognize the achievement of the teams and coaches that reach the school board's 'final four'.

McCauley started as a referee in 1967 and occupied the role of director of officials for the NHL at the time of his death.

He was, according to Gleeson, a strong supporter of

developmental programs in the north Halton area. In addition, it's hoped the carded referees will give athletes a basis for stronger recognition of the importance of athletic achievements.

Gleeson's Monarch Basketball is a non-profit organization which teaches the basic skills of basketball to children in Halton. This year more than 400 children participated in skill development programs, most of which were run out of Bishop Reding Secondary School.

Monarch annually contributes its surpluses back to the community to further develop the sport of basketball. The organization believes that this year's initiative of introducing accredited referees into the school board's program is one way of ensuring McCauley's work is remembered.

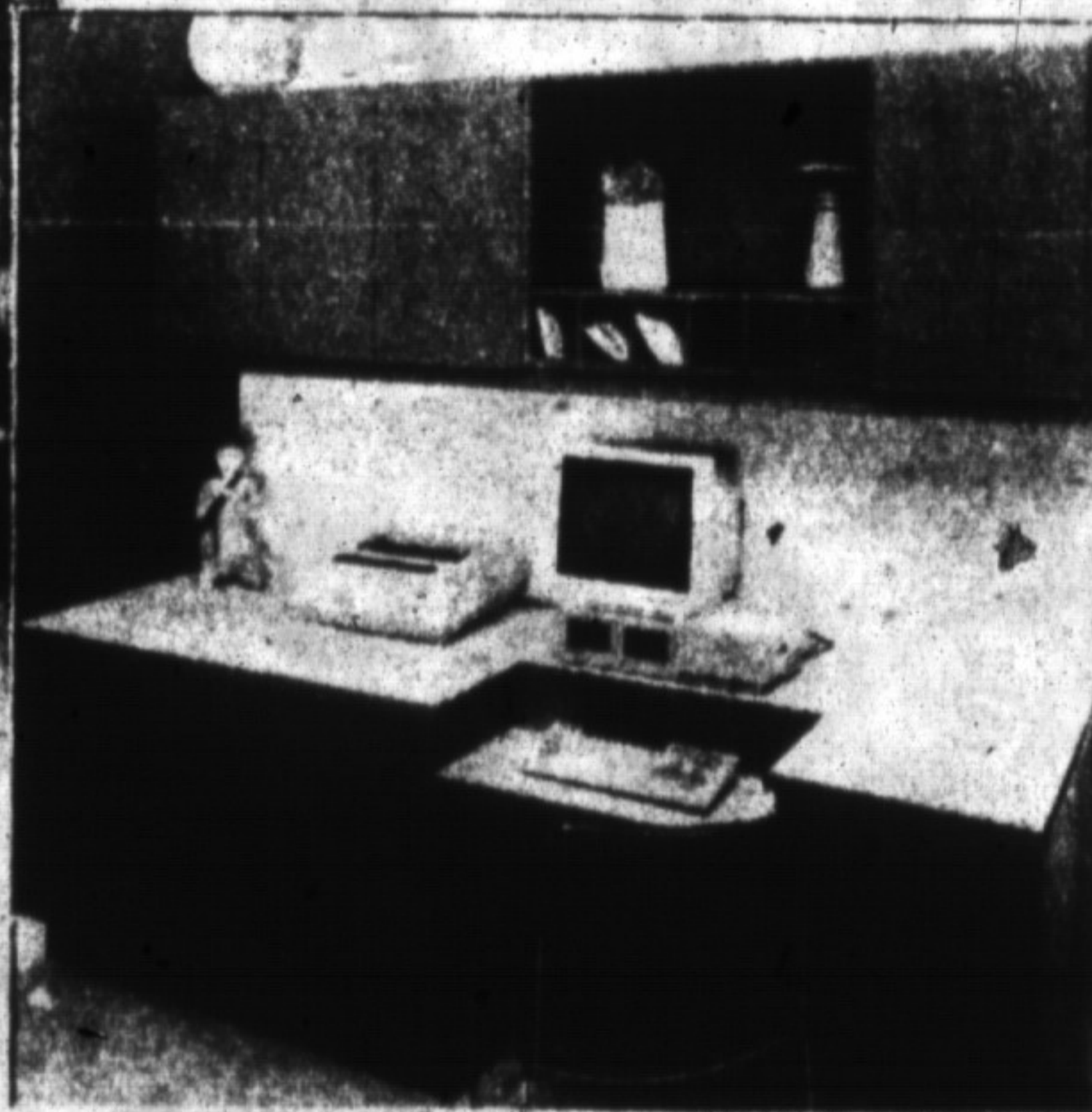
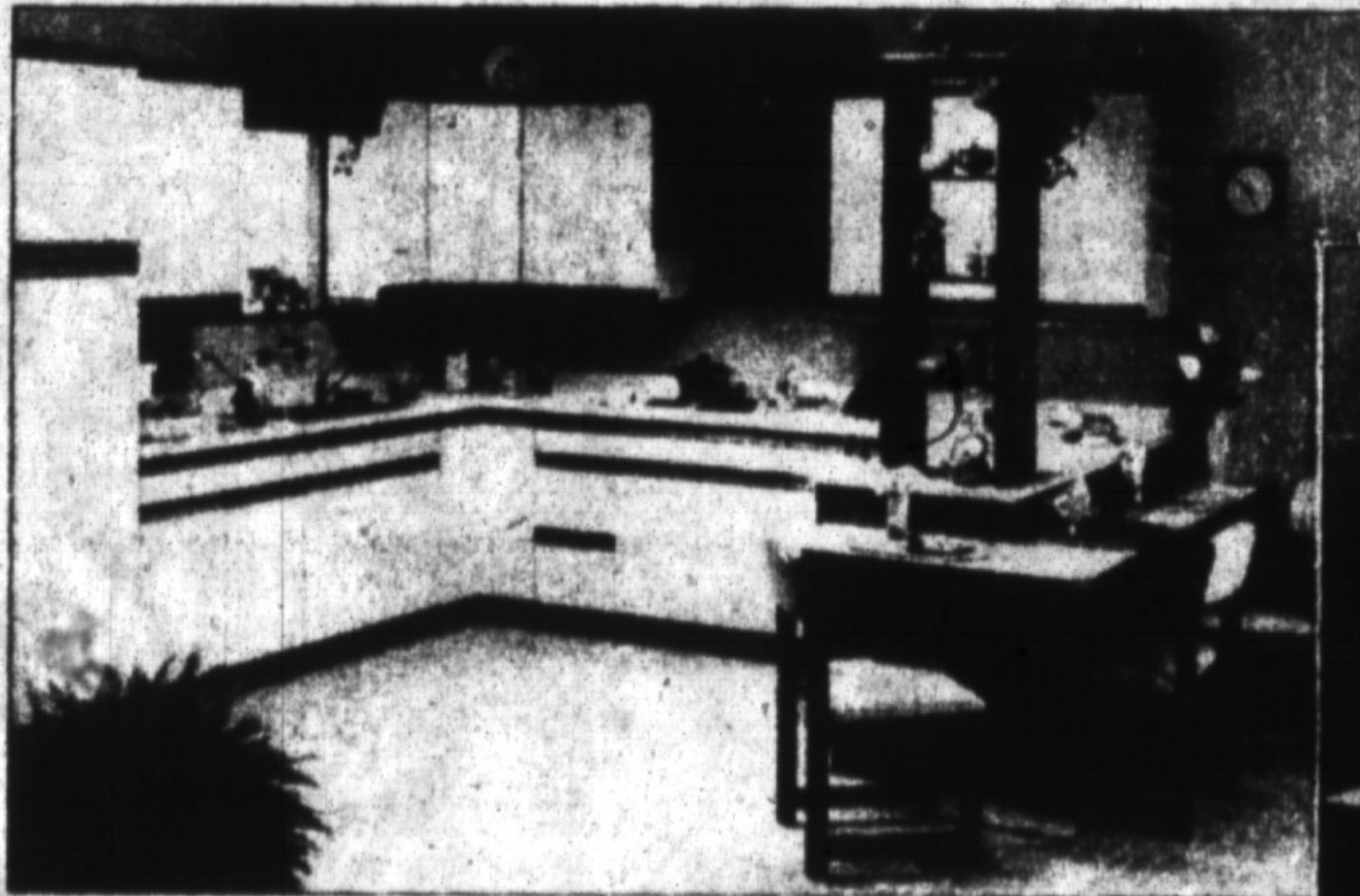
