# Register for Appleby sports

Appleby College's summer sports program is gearing up for its third season once again offering hockey, tennis, socces and a general sports slate. Both hockey and tennis are also offered at the advanced level.

The school operates at capacity most weeks with the emphasis on learning the sports rather than just playing the games. The full time programs are full-day affairs run on a weekly basis and are staffed by adult professional coaches.

All head instructors from last season are back: Kevin Grant (soccer), John Bassett (tennis), David Suchanek (exploring sports) and David Jenner (hockey).

The college facilities are used and include: a regulation sized arena, seven full sized playing fields, 25 metre indoor pool, 9,000 square foot gymnasium, softball diamonds, tennis courts, infirmary, athletic therapy centre, weight rooms, classrooms and dining halls.

Hockey features 2.5 hours of ice time daily in two sessions, goaltending instruction, groups by age and ability, video instruction, t- shirt and awards. Cost is \$199 per week with additional weeks for \$150.

Tennis features entry level to intermediate instruction, video instruction, guest instructors, etiquette, tshirt and awards. The cost is the same as hockey.

Soccer offered many of the same features as the other sports and costs \$119 per week. The exploring sports program includes a variety of activities like soccer, volleyball, swimming, softball and basketball. The cost is \$179 per week. Sessions run from late June to the end of August.

All regular hockey sessions still have openings. The June 29-July 3 session of tennis is full but other tennis sessions are open.
