Income tax help is closer to home

Unemployed workers won't be the only ones going to Canada Employment Centres now that a seasonal taxation assistance centre has opened at the Oakville location.

It is one of 22 such offices established across the country, National Revenue Minister Otto Jelinek announced Friday. The temporary office will be open from April 6 to 30, Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The Oakville Canada Employment Centre is lo-

cated at 635 Fourth Line, Oakville.

"Offering tax services from Canada Employment Centres is the first initiative to co-locate government services as announced in the Federal Budget," said Mr. Jelinek. "We are committed to reach out and offer help to taxpayers in a user-friendly, convenient and cost effective way."

This new Oakville tax assistance centre is an extension of the Hamilton District Taxation Office.

PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING
DEVELOPMENT CHARGES:
REVIEW OF POLICIES

The Council of the Regional Municipality of Halton passed By-laws Nos. 66-91, 67-91, 68-91, 69-71 and 70-91 on the 17th day of April, 1991 under section 4 of the Development Charges Act, 1989. The by-laws enacted new development charges and policies. The Region is now considering adopting a new by-law(s) under subsection 6(4) of the Act to replace the existing by-laws(s). Accordingly, Halton will conduct a review of the development charge policies of the municipality. The purpose of the review is to examine Halton's development charge policies and practices and to ensure their continued conformity to the Development Charges Act, 1989. The review will also examine to what extent should growth-related capital costs be recovered from development or existing ratepayers.

A Public Information Meeting pursuant to subsection 6(6) of the Act will be held to explain Halton's existing by-laws, policies and administrative practices with respect to development charges. The purpose of the Meeting is:

- to inform the public about current policies;
- to explain the proposed process to adopt new by-law(s); and
- to obtain initial public input for preparing new development charge policies.


The meeting will be held as a Special Meeting of the Administration and Finance Committee which is a Standing Committee of Regional Council. All interested persons are invited to attend the Public Information Meeting which will be held on:

Comments received in writing and those expressed at the Public Meeting will form input into a report outlining proposals to modify Regional development charge policies and a new development charge by-law(s). A Draft Proposal will be presented to the public at a Public Information Meeting on August 6, 1992 (tentative). A final report would then be presented to the Administration and Finance Committee on October 14, 1992 (tentative) and then to Council, along with supporting by-law(s), on October 21, 1992 (tentative).
