**Damage minimal
in downtown blaze**

Sparks from a propane torch being used to heat tar for roof patches are the likely cause of a fire in a downtown building yesterday.

Building owner Nick Mule was repairing the roof at the back of his 158 Main building when smoke began to rise from the attic at about 11:45 a.m. Tuesday.

Milton Fire Department responded with about 20 firefighters on the scene and equipment dispatched from both Central Fire Station and Station 3.

Fire Chief Richard Playfair said the quickness of response and getting the equipment in place played a significant role in getting the fire under control. Firefighters were on the scene for just more than an hour.

He could put no price on the damage but said it was limited to a hole in the roof as well as smoke and water damage to the attic and a second floor room.

The wind picked up at one point while the blaze was being fought, causing some concern, the Chief explained.

He noted there is always cause for concern when a fire occurs in an area like downtown Milton which is "congested with structures".

Several residents of apartments in the front of the building were asked to leave their homes while the fire was in progress.

Chief Playfair said the incident is being viewed as an accident and not of a suspicious nature.

Chickens die in fire

About 6,000 chicks died in an Eighth Line fire early Saturday morning.

The blaze destroyed two of three barns on the property north of Lower Base Line, said Deputy Chief Harold Penson of the Milton Fire Department.

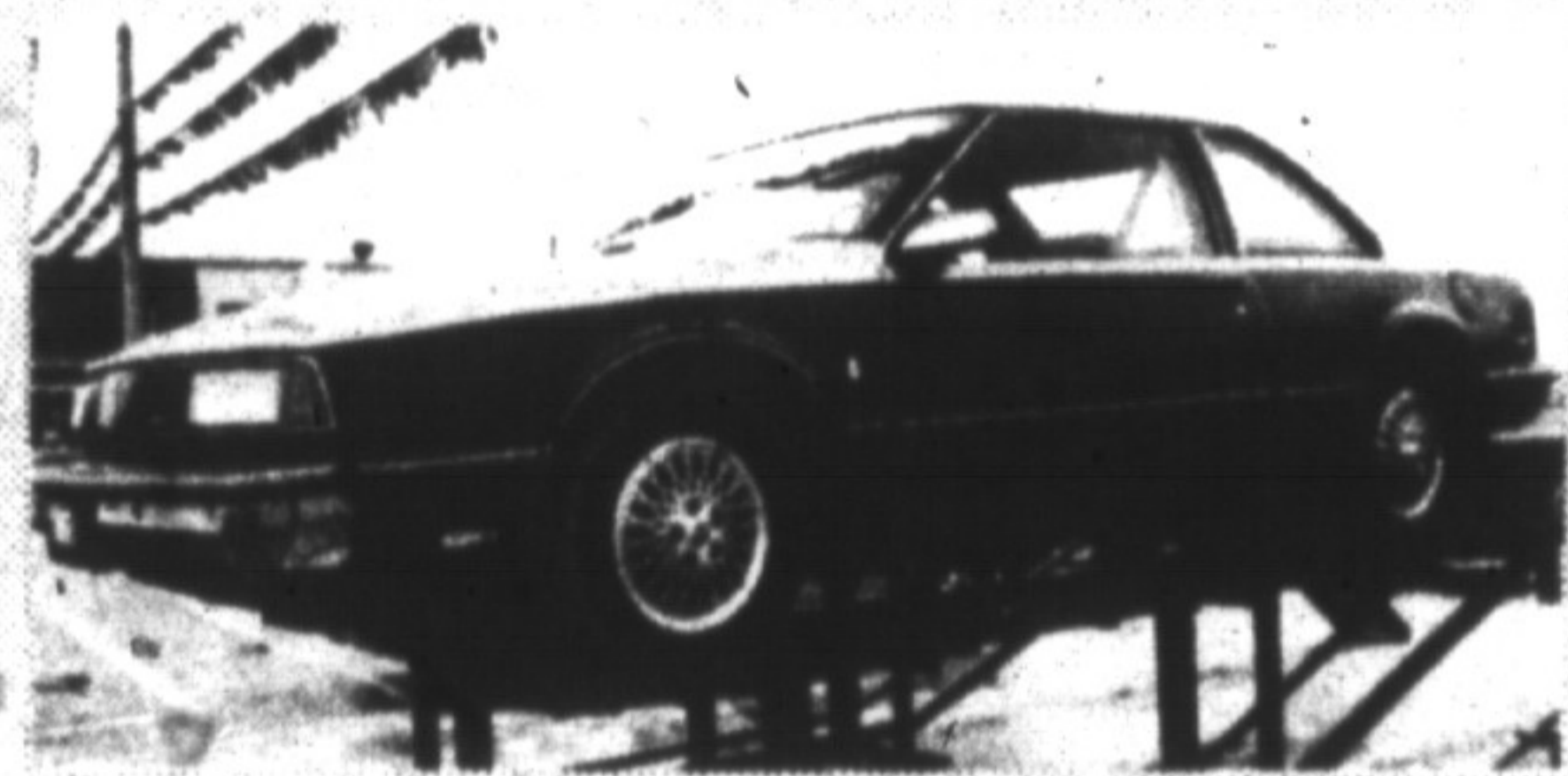
One of the buildings had already burned to the ground by the time firefighters arrived at about 3:50 a.m.

The blaze may have been caused by faulty propane heaters, said Halton police. A damage estimate was not available at press time.
