The league banquet and awards dance is scheduled for April 25 at the Optimist Centre.

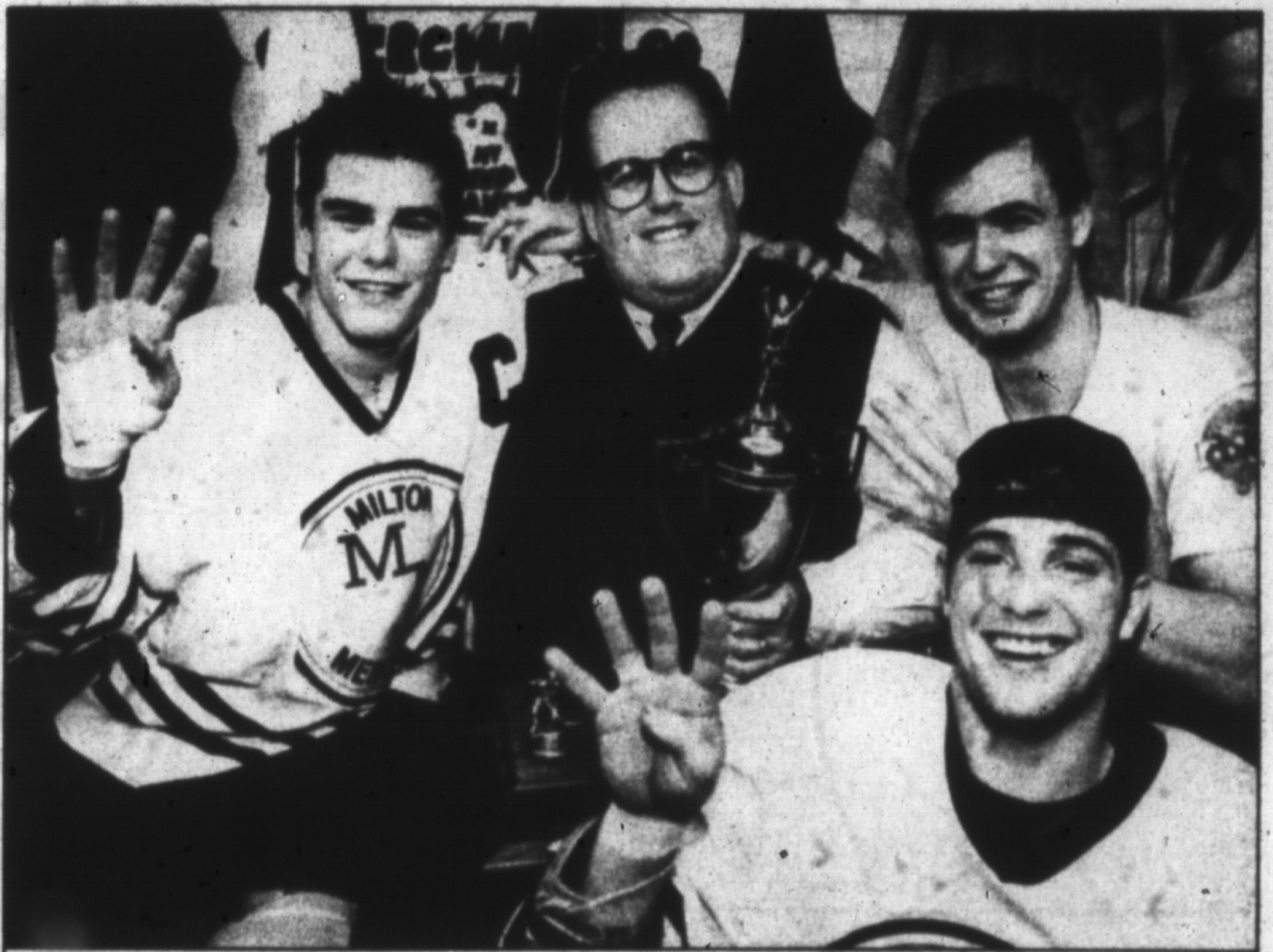
