

Robinson and Brown dominate Mohawk's Youthful Pacing Series

Gale guided sophomore Three Wizzards to a close second in a heat of the Little Brown Jug behind Precious Bunny and they finished third in the final. Three Wizzards also

Gale guided Centre Channel from the Bob McIntosh stable to a third place finish in race one Saturday evening, and managed a trip to the winner's circle following a 1:56.4 victory with Big Finish, a son of Cam Fella in the third \$9,000 division of the second leg of the Youthful Pacing Series, also for trainer McIntosh.

Other racing news

Trainer Bill Robinson and driver Doug Brown continue to dominate Mohawk's Youthful Pacing Series. Sunday night in the first \$9,000 division, trainer Robinson and driver Brown teamed up for a 1:57.1 victory with Clemente, a son of No Nukes in the first division of the second leg.

Clemente took over past a 28.2 second opening quarter to pace to a 58.4 half, a 1:28 three-quarter and

stop the clock at 1:57.1, one length ahead of Camfire and Rapidcam. It was No Nukes fourth win in six starts and bumped his season's bankroll to \$20,755 for owner Bill Elliott of Woodstock.

In the second division Robinson trainees finished first and second as J CS Skiparoo sat in the pocket behind Colts Gait Boca from the half until the mid-stretch when he pulled out to pace his stablemate for a head victory in a swift 1:56 for driver Steve Condren. It was the Forrest Skipper offspring's fourth win in six outings and increased his 1992 earnings to more than \$20,000 for owner-breeder Joseph Caputo of New Jersey.

In the first leg, Sunday, March 22 Robinson and Brown scored a hat trick sending J CS Skiparoo, Colts Gait Boco and Village Tavern to the winner's circle.

The third leg of the series goes postward on April 5 and the \$30,000 (est.) final goes behind the starting gate on April 12.

The Monarch midget girls basketball team travelled to St. Andrew's College in Aurora recently for a pair of exhibition games against teams from Barrie and North York.

Milton had the full 15 team members on hand, and despite their tough competition, managed to earn a split.

The Barrie Royals proved difficult due to their excellent perimeter shooting. The Monarch defence, led by Michelle Maynard and Shailene Jeffrey all but shut down the Royals when they pressured the shooter at every opportunity.

Angela Hrtak led the offence with eight points while at the same time controlling the boards at both ends of the court. Jayne Currie put in a strong two way effort and Linda Lipari knocked down an early basket to put Milton on the board.

Milton led after the first quarter 6-2 and opened up a six point margin at the half when they led 12-6.

Good defence held Barrie to only a single basket in the third quarter. Briar Ross and Andrea LeBannister led the way. Kim Ramsay combined with Kelly Douglas and Nicola Daykin to pressure the Barrie team. Barrie became frustrated and began taking personal fouls.

Shannon Ridley was a constant threat under both baskets. Barrie hung tough however, only finishing one point back 21-20 at the final buzzer.

The second game of the day began a mere 15 minutes after the game against Barrie. Milton's second opponent, the Metro Raiders from North York, were well rested when they took to the floor against Milton.

Milton's objective was to continue their team development. Every effort was made to give all team members a chance to realize the goal.

First year midgets saw considerable action in the second contest. Renee Ross, Douglas and LeBannister looked comfortable on offence and defence. Joanne Meek came off the bench to apply pressure on defence. Hrtak provided most of the scoring punch netting 12 points.

By the fourth quarter the extra game began to take its toll on the Monarch squad. Michelle Maynard ran into foul trouble.

With less than a minute to play the score was tied 25-25. The lead shifted between the teams with North York netting a basket at the final buzzer to nail down a 31-27 win.

On the weekend the Milton team downed Brantford 40-25 on Friday at Milton District High School and then outscored North York 47-40 on Saturday at Bishop Reding.

The Monarch girls are preparing for a weekend tournament in London on April 10-12 where the provincial championships will be held.
