Downtown merchants must decide what they want: planner

A senior planner for the Region urged members of Milton's downtown business community to have their say in the future growth of Halton Tuesday night.

Everyone must form a "strong partnership" to maintain Milton's "vibrant downtown," David McCleary of the Region of Halton told members of the Milton Downtown Business Improvement Area (DBIA) at Papa Nick's Hotel.

Noting that change is inevitable for the area, he said Miltonians are certain of what they don't want for the future of the town, but are unsure of what they do want.

"They have a hard time communicating what they want, but they have an easy time communicating what they don't want," he said at the DBIA's annual general meeting.

The Halton Urban Structure Review, an elaborate study aimed at

mapping potential growth plans for the region, is looking at various aspects of expansion.

Milton is estimated to receive 20 to 25 per cent of Halton's growth over the next 20 years, Mr. McCleary said.

But keeping Milton's small town atmosphere appears to be important among residents, he said.

He said he'd like to see the town's downtown area follow in the footsteps of Oakville's popular core, and warned members about the Burlington downtown's fall due to the

erection of shopping centres.

"Burlington Mall killed the downtown area," he explained.

Locating enough water to support another 10,000 people in the town is a possibility for the area, he said.

While he didn't know where or when development in the Milton area would begin, the senior planner said studies should be completed in 18 months.

"It's at that point the decision making will begin," he commented. "There's going to be winners and losers."
