Moving into the bronze medal round Price recovered to score yet another superiority victory, 12-0 over Nathan Seiling of South Wellington. His next opponent was number one seed Blair Boudreau.

Price ran up a 7-2 lead and put Boudreau on his back for the last minute of the first round. Boureau was saved by the bell. In round two he held a 9-5 lead into the last minute when a flurry of action, in rapid succession occurred. When the dust settled both the scorers and officials were confused and in disagreement as to the score.

Finally they proclaimed a mere one point lead for Price. Boudreau scored a two point tilt in the dying seconds to steal the victory. Although disappointed Price put the loss behind him to win his final in outstanding fashion, 13-0 over Pauline Johnson's Joshi Sudheem to claim a well deserved fifth place ribbon.

The best was yet to come as Spence was to cap off the

most impressive OPSAA performance ever by a Drury wrestler. Except for a single loss to top seed John Van Kampen, Spence dominated every match against some of the top grapplers in Ontario.

After pinning Gerald Boudreau of Garneau Secondary School and Ravendo Azevado of Dunbarton, Spence battled VanKampen, putting him on his back three times before losing by a decision.

Advancing to day two, Spence peaked to give his finest career effort. He started by pinning St. Paul's Greg Pedley to reach the final eight. With only top guns left Spence ran off three consecutive superiority victories. First was a 15-2 win over fourth ranked Castro Mensah of North Albion, second a 14-2 win over Tom Antonucci, the number three ranked wrestler from Sandwick and finally an astounding 16-4 bronze medal win over highly regarded Jim Drivakis of Meadowvale, number two ranked.


