

Mustangs ride six doubles to 10-1 victory over QE Park

The Milton District Mustang baseball team started the short Halton season off on the right foot with a 10-1 win over Oakville's Q.E. Park Eagles, Tuesday at Burlington's Ireland Park.

Milton rode a strong pitching performance by Duane Eggleton and six doubles to the win.

The only blemish on Eggleton was a monster homer to left hit by Andrew Greig to lead off the second frame and break a scoreless tie.

The Mustangs got back-to-back doubles by Eggleton and first baseman Ryan Peddie to tie the score in the bottom of the second before notching three runs in the third and

five in the fifth to clinch.

Back-to-back doubles by brothers Mark and Mike McPhail keyed the fifth inning explosion.

A couple of sterling defensive plays, one by Mike McPhail to out-

run a long fly ball to centre, and another when Peddie and McDuffe combined to erase a baserunner, with catcher McDuffe making a tag putout at first base, helped keep the Eagles' offence in check.

Milton's next game is today

(Friday), scheduled for Brian Best Park at 3:15 p.m., when they host Loyola (Oakville). The Mustangs first game, originally scheduled for Brian Best Park, had to be changed when town officials determined that play would damage the soggy field.

Kitchener's Andy Zetic scored on a breakaway, shorthanded, at 17:14 of the first but Milton's Joel McArter chipped in a rebound less than a minute later to restore the one goal edge.

Shawn Healey had a breakaway in the closing minute but couldn't beat Rutledge.

Milton got a powerplay goal from Todd Blackman as he was allowed to step right up into the slot before

firing a wrist shot behind Rutledge for a 4-2 lead.

Kitchener's Rob Asselstine began the Dutchman comeback when he chopped in a rebound from the left side of the crease.

Derek Innanen blew a shot past Chipman to tie it, after using the lone Milton defenceman as a screen. On his next shift Innanen beat Mike Murray one-on-one before lifting the puck upstairs on the short side for the second Kitchener shorthanded goal of the game.

Kitchener was allowed to add to their total when Mike Allen was able to come in unimpeded from the right wing corner.

Milton tied the game when Ritchie picked up a Kitchener mistake and fired a rocket past Rutledge from the slot, and Rick Emmett scored after taking the puck in all the way from his own blueline.

"We'll try to open it up tomorrow (Wednesday) but they'll play the clutch and grab," Kearns said.
