Student to meet the world

A simple trip to Wisconsin will teach a Milton student all about the world next month.

Carol Newman, in Grade 12 at Milton District High School, will participate in a world affairs seminar held in the northern state from June 14 to 19.

The Rotary Club of Milton, which annually sends students on educational excursions, is sponsoring the trip. Members of the local service club were impressed with what the seminar has to offer, said Walter Miller of the organization.

Carol will join about other 1,000 North American students and 250 students from around the world in the seminar which examines world issues as seen from a youth's perspective.

The 18-year-old said she believes the trip will provide an opportunity for her to "learn more about other countries' problems" and discuss her own concerns about the world today.

The environment and history are subjects she most enjoys talking about, said Carol who is aspiring to become a history teacher. She said she's looking forward to meeting new people and making friends.
