From 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday,

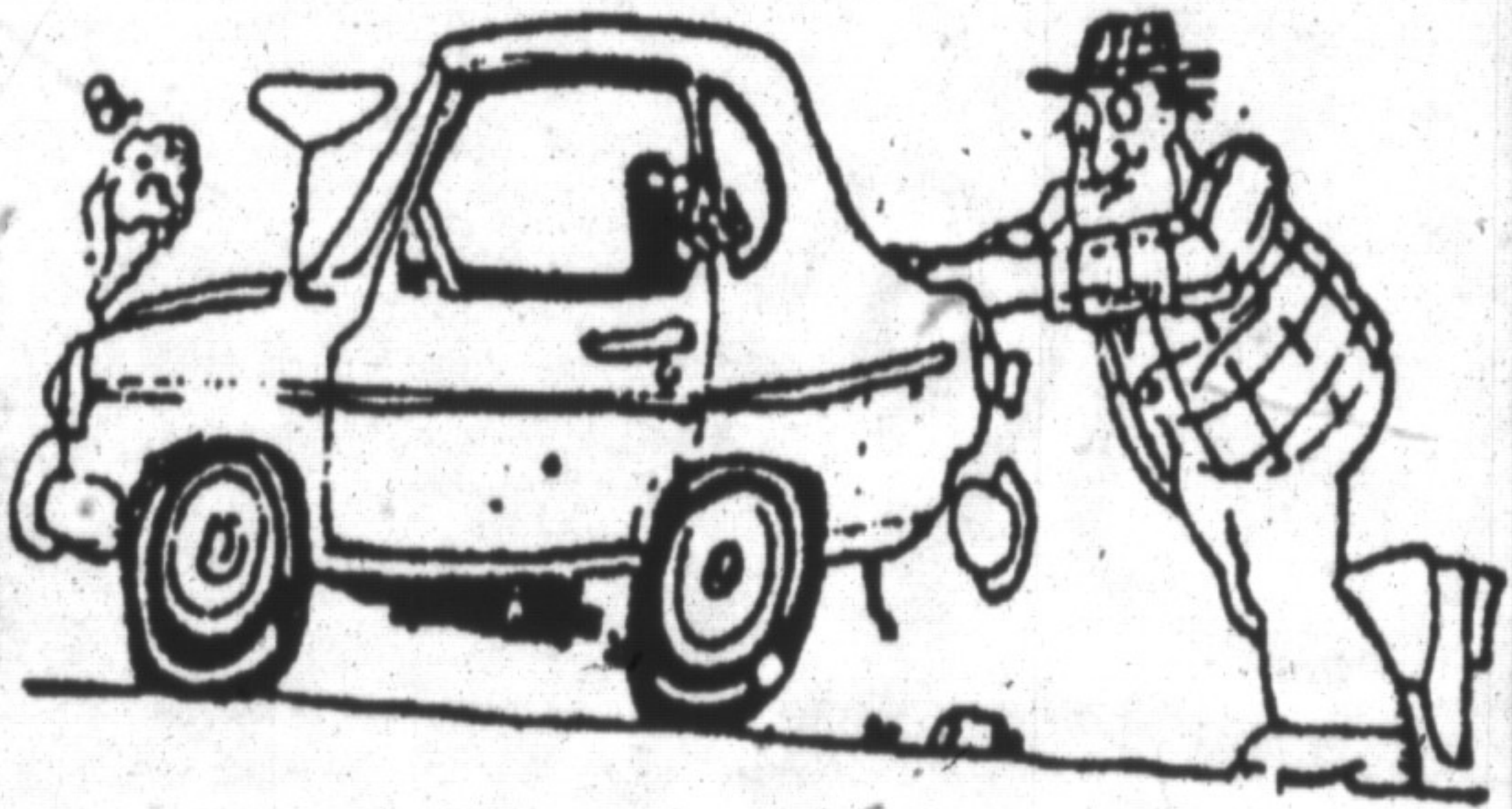

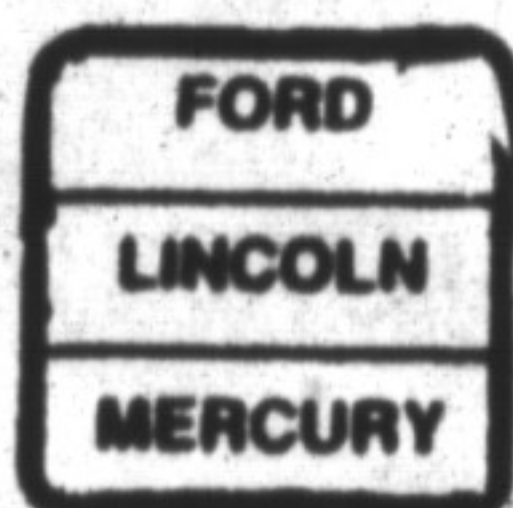
