## Baseball bats used in assault on two residents

Halton police are seeking the whereabouts of two Milton men wanted in connection with vicious assaults on two patrons of a Main Street tavern early Friday morning.

A 31-year-old man and 28-year-old woman, both of Milton, were hit on the head with baseball bats at Papa Nick's Hotel at about 12:40 a.m. The suspects then fled out the back door.

The victims — witnesses in an upcoming trial — were treated for cuts to the head requiring stitches.

The suspects, Gary Cooper, 39, and Douglas Gwilt, 27, both of the same Mill Street address, are believed to be "on the run" to avoid being arrested, said Detective Sergeant Mike Eacrett.

Both men have been charged with wounding, assault with a weapon, and obstructing justice.

### Boy hit by train

A Markham boy hit by a train on the CP Rail tracks west of Fourth Line Monday night escaped serious injury.

The 16-year-old youth left the residence of Trillium School in Milton after having an argument with another student, police said.

Determined to walk home to Markham, the teen set out eastbound on the north side of the westbound tracks after 7 p.m.

A train approached, but the boy failed to jump out of the way in time. He was struck on the right

arm. The youth was thrown into the ditch on the north side of the tracks near Thompson Road and Fourth Line.

The train stopped and the injured boy who by this time was conscious and walking, was picked up, police said. He was taken to the Milton GO Station, transported to Milton District Hospital, and released later that evening.

### Inmate assaulted

A 19-year-old inmate at Maplehurst Correctional Centre has reported being assaulted in a washroom of the Milton jail by two other inmates.

The youth told police one of the suspects last month held him from behind while the other stabbed him in the head with a pen.

Charged with assault with a weapon are two 21-year-old men.

### House break-ins

Compact discs, tape cassettes, and a gold ring were stolen from a Woodward Avenue home in an evening break-in Friday. Thieves smashed a rear basement window to gain entry into the house between 10 and 11:30 p.m. The estimated total value of the merchandise is \$600.

A home on No. 25 Sideroad was the target of thugs who appear to have left empty-handed Monday afternoon. The culprits cut the screen on an open window and crawled into the house. The bedrooms were ransacked, but nothing was taken.

### Woman shot in robbery

The Halton Regional Police in Oakville and Crime Stoppers of Halton need the public's assistance in identifying the two men responsible for the break and enter and armed robbery and shooting of an Oakville resident.

On Thursday, Apr. 30 at about 3:10 p.m., a 29 year old mother and her two-year-old son arrived home on Richmond Road in Oakville. The woman entered her house from the garage into the kitchen. She immediately observed one male fleeing from the house. A second male confronted her two-year-old son and pointed a flare gun at him. The mother went to the aid of her son and during a brief struggle with the suspect was shot in her left shoulder.

The second suspect then fled via the rear sliding door and used the hydro right-of-way as an escape route.

The suspect responsible for shooting the victim is described as a white male, 20 years old, 5' 8", 170 pounds with a slim build and medium length brown hair. He was wearing a white sweatshirt, faded blue jeans with a tear in the left leg above the knee, white tennis shoes, gloves and a nylon stocking mask.

The second suspect was observed for a split second and there is no description available.
