

# Spartan seniors manage big soccer win over

The E.C. Drury High School boys senior soccer team played an intense and exciting game last week against Oakville's White Oaks, but they came out on the wrong end of the 1-0 score.

White Oaks scored the only goal of the game in the first half. Brad Burns played an exceptional game in the Spartan net.

The girls senior team managed a 3-2 win over rival Milton District High School. Jennifer Cheevers scored the first goal for Drury but Milton District came right back with a quick marker for the 1-1 tie.

Michelle Maynard gave the Spartans the lead again, early in the second half but the Mustangs managed to score themselves. With about seven minutes to go in the game Daniel Doucette scored the winning goal from the 18

## Milton District falls to league power house

Two Spartan runs in the first, and two in the second, all coming with two outs, was enough to put the lid on E.C. Drury's 7-2 baseball win over Milton District at Brian Best Park on Monday afternoon.

But for the key third out in the early innings Milton District kept the game close. Drury added a two run third and a single run in the fifth while Milton countered with single runs in the first two innings.

E.C. Drury's Craig Holloway led the way with three hits including two doubles. Teammate Derek MacDonald started on the hill and claimed the win going four innings. MacDonald left the game after striking out the side in the fourth. He pitched the maximum number of frames a high school pitcher can throw in a game.

Milton District managed two hits in each of the first three innings but couldn't get the clutch two-out hit to keep the game close.

Mike McPhail pitched a solid four innings for the Mustangs. He was the victim of an error in the first which brought home two runs and a Jamie Janjevich triple in the second which accounted for two more. In the third frame an error put Spartan hitter Phil Greig on. He later scored on Glen McCallister's double. The other run came across on a bases loaded walk by McPhail.

For Milton District, Ryan Peddie brought home a run on a ground out and second baseman Mark McPhail drove home another when his single in the second frame brought in Dave Stevenson, who had also singled.

Drury got excellent relief work from Jim Fenn who pitched a pair of scoreless innings, and Kevin O'Donnell who toed the rubber in the last frame. Milton District also was given every chance to get back into the game behind the relief work of Jim Fay who went three innings, giving up only one run.

The win puts E.C. Drury at a commanding 5-0 in the short eight game season while Milton District falls to 1-2. Drury's next contest is on Wednesday when they host unbeaten Georgetown at Brian Best Park. The Mustangs take the field the next day when they are hosted by Bishop Reding on the same field.

## Canada Brick juveniles win pair

The opening contest against Oakville, a 14-4 win for Milton, saw

everybody contribute to the offensive explosion.

Phil "No-name" Greig was five for seven across the two games. Jamie Janjevich was four for six, Mike McPhail was three for five, Fenn two for three, and O'Donnell, Craig Holloway, MacDonald and Eggleton all had two hits in the first contest.
