Sign language immersion course offered at E. C. Drury

Spend a week taking up a new and challenging language and learning to communicate with the deaf, July 13 to 17.

The Canadian Hearing Society is offering an immersion program in American Sign Language at E.C. Drury School in Milton. For a full week, participants will be able to "eat, drink and sleep sign language."

The program is intended for professionals having contact with the deaf community in their work, and for relatives, co-workers, friends or neighbours of a deaf person.

Each course in the Level 1 program is \$90, plus \$55 for materials; \$95 in the Level 2 program, plus \$75 for materials.

Registration will take place at The Canadian Hearing Society from now until June 12, during business hours 9 a.m. to 5 p.m..

The office is located at 3034 Palstan Road, Suite 201, in Mississauga.

Anyone with some signing skills is advised to call ahead to set up an appointment for a sign language assessment to determine the level in which to register.

There is a \$5 fee for the assessment, payable at the time of the appointment.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF RATE INCREASE

Milton Evergreen Cemetery

RATES: Pursuant to the new Cemeteries Act and Regulations proclaimed in force on April 1st, 1992, Milton Evergreen Cemetery finds it necessary to increase the prices of most interment rights (formerly known as grave purchases) and other services, effective on Monday, June 1st, 1992.

Interment rights prices will be increasing approximately 8% on that date. Any pre-need sales taking place prior to June 1st will be processed at the present rates.

New interment rights charges, effective June 1, will be:

- Adult Graves \$600 Cremation Graves \$275
- Infant Graves \$175 Child Graves \$400
- Cluster gardens \$200 surcharge

INTERMENTS: All fees remain the same, with the addition of a new \$10 per interment licencing fee. This fee will be remitted to the Province of Ontario to assist in covering the cost of administering the new Act and Regulations. This fee is also effective on June 1st, 1992.

MONUMENT LEVY: After June 15th, a new levy on monument and marker installations will be introduced, to comply with new legislation incorporated in the Act. Levies (\$50 for a flat marker; \$100 for a small monument; \$200 for larger monuments) will be added to all foundation charges and installation fees. This levy will be deposited in the Cemetery's Care and Maintenance Fund, to finance future repairs of unsafe monuments.

BYLAWS: This notice is also to advise that a new book of Cemetery By-Laws is being drafted, to meet the terms and conditions as set out in the new Cemetery Act and Regulations, and will be forwarded to the Ontario Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations, Cemeteries Regulation Branch, for approval. 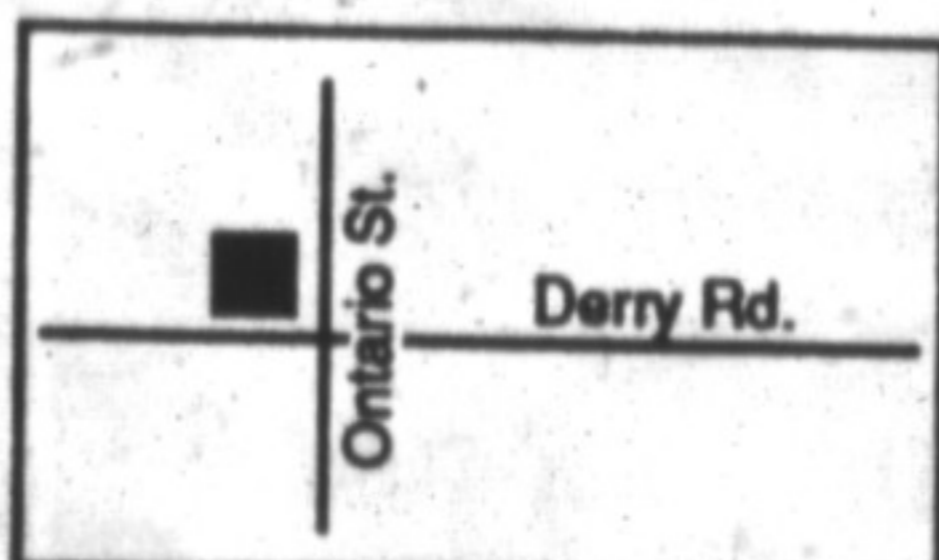

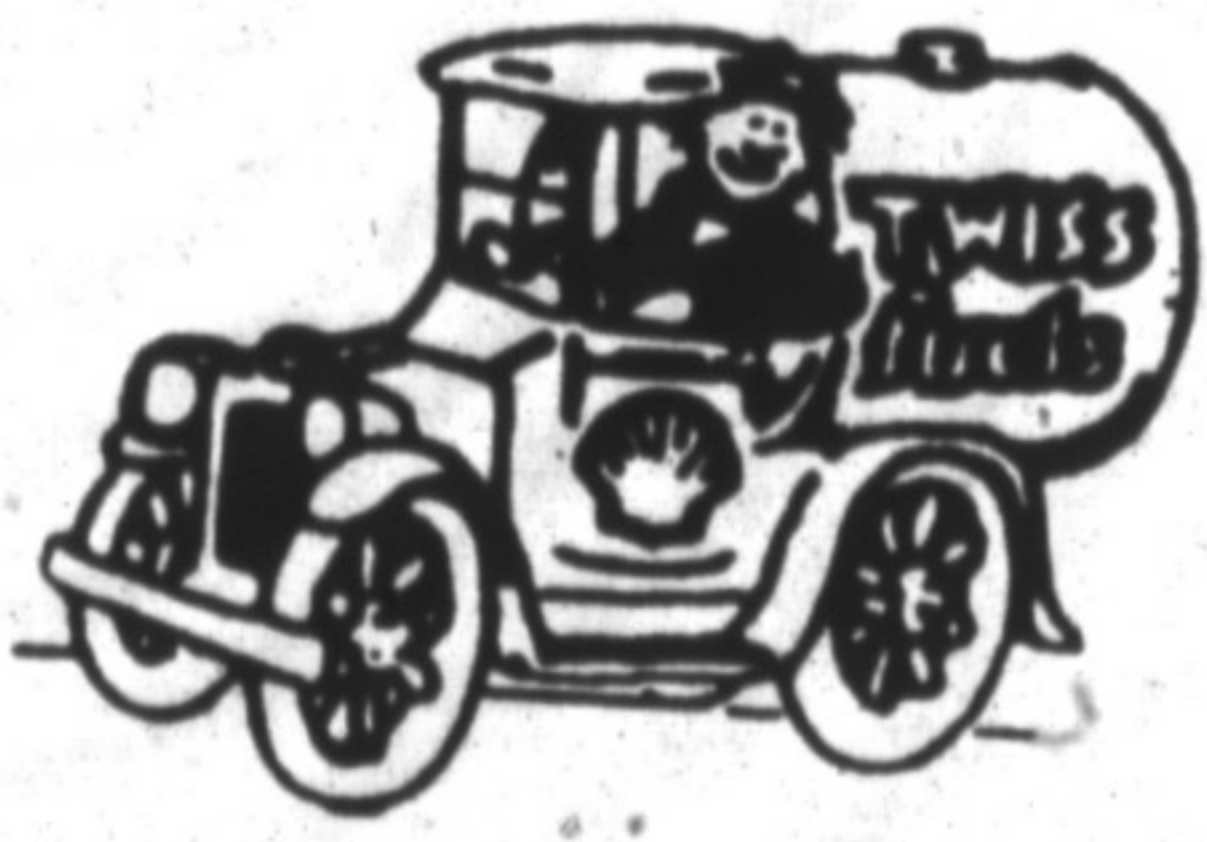
