# Mohawk spring meet stats

Mohawk Raceway's 51 date spring meet, which closed on Sunday attracted 332,928 patrons to Mohawk and Greenwood Intertrack, for an average of 6,528 daily, down 4.1 per cent from the daily average of 6,809 in 1991.

Total wagering was \$65,241,533 resulting in a daily average handle of \$1,279,246 which represents a decline of 5.9 per cent from 1991's average handle of \$1,359,158. On track the Mohawk spring meet was highlighted by the Youthful, Princess and Mohawk Pacing Series, and the first ever Drivers' Charity Challenge.

Doug Brown continued to dominate the drivers' standings, leading all Ontario Jockey Club drivers with 59 wins and \$544,619 in purse money.

Trainer Bill Elliott from the William Robinson stable sent 22 winners postward and trained horses to \$308,255 in purse earnings.

On June 1, Greenwood opened its doors for 70 days of major league harness racing, offering over \$8 million in purse money. The stakes calendar will be highlighted by the \$1 Million North American Cup-Canada's richest harness race, on June 20, with eliminations going postward on June 13.

Other major pacing events include the \$200,000 Burlington Pacing Stakes on June 6; the Roses Are Red Pacing Stakes for fillies and mares, three years old and up on July 18; and the Molson Export Pacing Series for aged pacers on July 11 and 18, culminating in the \$240,000 Canadian Pacing Derby on July 25.

The \$100,000 (est) Canadian Trotting Classic will be featured on Saturday, June 13 and the \$100,000 Maple Leaf Trot Invitation, featuring North America's finest aged trotters will go postward on Saturday, August 15.

Racing will be conducted five nights a week at the lakeside oval: Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays with a 7:30 p.m. post time each night. There will be a special matinee race card at Greenwood on Sunday, August 2 with a 1:30 p.m. post time.
