

# Red Sox hit losing skid, drop three games in a row

Three losses in a row have dropped the Milton Red Sox senior baseball team to a 5-6 record on the year.

"We have to get our minds set and get back on the winning track," said Red Sox manager Glen Turner. He blamed his team's troubles on a top heavy schedule which had Milton playing seven games in 14 days. "We haven't been mentally prepared. I think that's because we're tired."

The Sox lost 12-9 in Oakville back on June 1. Milton counted four times in the fourth keyed by consecutive doubles by Charlie Hyatt and Brent Currie but they allowed the A's back into the contest with five in the bottom of the inning to take a 7-4 lead.

Milton bounced back with four more in the sixth frame using singles by Rick McTrach, Hyatt, Al Dairou and Doug Dunn to do most of the

damage. Oakville claimed two more in their half of the inning to claim a 9-8 lead. Three more in the eighth capped the win. Milton's Tim Chapman took the loss giving up 12 runs, eight of them earned despite striking out seven across eight and two-thirds innings.

Milton then travelled to Burlington to take on the 8-0 Brants. According to Turner, Burlington simply hit the Milton pitchers in walking away with an 11-9 win. Generally, Turner was happy with the game against the first place squad saying that they were beaten by a better team, rather than giving the game away with mistakes.

Dairou started the contest and was replaced by Brian Kempster in the seventh. Kempster took the loss giving up four runs of the nine that the Brants managed to push across the plate in the final two frames.

Paul Eveleigh, a former Inter-County League player with Brantford, picked up the win in

relief of Burlington starter Gord Ritchie. Ritchie was knocked out by the Red Sox in their big sixth inning where they counted four runs.

Sean Davidson was three-for-five, Chapman two-for-four, Bill Corradetti and Matt McCandless each were two-for-five in the hitting department for Milton. Milton outthrew Burlington 13-9.

The Red Sox hosted Erindale on Saturday and came out on the wrong end of an 8-4 final.

The game was tied 3-3 into the eighth. Erindale managed a leadoff walk, a bunt single and an attempted

sacrifice that was fielded and fired into right field by Milton pitcher Paul McCutcheon who slipped on the wet infield grass. Two runs came home on the error and Erindale managed to push two more past the shocked Sox for a 7-3 lead.

George Moore pitched six frames for Milton and was relieved by McCutcheon who took the loss. Scott Gadd came in to finish up. For Erindale Ed Howell picked up the win with a complete game performance.

McCandless was three-for-four while John Blasko and McTrach were two-for-four. Milton scored

their runs with one in the first, two in the fourth and one in the final frame.

"We've blown our chances for doing real well this season," said Turner. "I figure we'll end in the middle of the pack and, take our chances in the playoffs. We just got on the wrong roll."

The Red Sox have the weekend off. They had planned to play in the Streetsville Tournament but it was cancelled. They play in the Samia Tournament June 19-21 and return home for a league game on Saturday, June 27.
