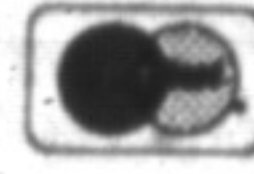

TAX NOTICE

Ratepayers of The Town of Milton are reminded that the First Instalment of the 1992 Final Tax Bill is due on June 30, 1992.

Tax Payments must be received in the Tax Office on or before the Due Date to avoid penalty. Late payment charge of 1-1/4% will be charged on the first day of default and on the first day of each calendar month in which the default continues. It is the responsibility of the ratepayer to ensure that the taxes are paid by the due date, even in the event that the bill is not received as mailed.

Taxes may be paid at the Milton and Campbellville Branches of the Bank of Nova Scotia. (There is a small service charge).

There is no GST charged on taxes.
