Men to join contest for Milton Fall Fair ambassador

Don't call it a beauty pageant around Sandra McSpurren.

The engaging 20-year-old reigning Miss Milton Fall Fair will gently correct that terminology. "There's no such thing as a beauty pageant" anymore, she insists.

In fact the Halton Agricultural Society, which sponsors the event, seems to agree. This year the contest will be called the Ambassador of Milton Fall Fair Pageant, and it will be open to both men and women.

Ms McSpurren says one of the four people she knows of who is thinking of entering is a young man.

Beauty pageants have fallen on hard times lately, criticized as sexist by many due to their past fixation on female physical beauty. The change in emphasis by the Milton Fair Board and other similar organizations is a move aimed at countering that image. The Canadian National Exhibition contest, at which the various area fall fair winners compete, is now called the "Ambassador of the Fairs" pageant, too.

Physical attributes aren't the priority in the Milton event, Ms McSpurren said. "Basically, the Halton

Agricultural Society wants someone to represent Milton to the best of their ability."

She hopes she has done that in her one-year tenure. "I loved it. I wish I could run again." She believes the work made her a more complete person. Prior to it, "I was not as outgoing, as positive."

Ms McSpurren lives in urban Milton, not the outlying rural area, but doesn't feel that is a drawback in promoting agriculture since events like the fall fair largely draw urban dwellers who otherwise rarely get close to any farm operations. "It's a place where they can touch base with agriculture."

As a goodwill representative, Ms McSpurren took part in recent Canada 125 celebrations in Milton and has had similar duties at Steam Era, the Chili Fest United Way fundraising event in Campbellville and at the Canadian Na-
