Real estate spring sales sink

May flowers bloomed last month but, unfortunately, this market for a property to stay on the market for bearea real estate sales didn't follow suit, according to figures released by the Oakville, Milton and District Real Estate Board.

The dollar volume of real estate sales dropped to \$42.6 million last month - 27 per cent lower than April's total of \$58.5 million and 24 per cent lower than the \$55.8 million recorded a year ago.

"It's a tough market to predict," noted REB president Mark Mallalieu. "We thought a few months ago that the real estate market had turned the corner toward full recovery but last month's figures show things haven't improved quite as much as we had expected."

Mr. Mallalieu advised vendors to set a realistic price for their property based on recent sales in their area.

"We're finding that prices in most areas have fallen slightly over the past few years and it's not unusual in

tween six months and a year before selling," Mr. Mallalieu said.

While that can put some vendors in a stressful situation, Mr. Mallalieu said those who can buy right now are finding that conditions are better than they've been in many years. Interest rates are low and prices are stable. First-time buyers and anyone with RRSPs can also take advantage of government-sponsored incentive plans.

"We strongly encourage anyone thinking of buying or selling right now to use the services of a local real estate salesperson," Mr. Mallalieu said.

"Our salespeople are well-versed in helping vendors determine an appropriate selling price for their property," he added. "They can also advise prospective purchasers on local market conditions and help them find a suitable new home."
