

Riding the rails



Hundreds of curious spectators checked out the collection of antique street-cars and rode the rails at the annual Summer Extravaganza at the Halton Radial Railway Museum recently. (Photo above) A conductor, one of the volunteers who helps operate the museum, crosses the tracks ahead of a 1934 replica of an 1893 open-sided car which travelled Toronto streets until 1915 when open-sided cars were outlawed. Brian Hume (photo left), works on restoring a 1915 London and Port Stanley Interurban car. The car, which has been five-years in the restoration, weighs 50 tons and had a top speed of 95 mph.
