Girl assaulted in home

A Georgetown man faces several charges after a 17-year-old Milton girl's life and the safety of her family was threatened.

In a four-day crime spree July 5 to 9, a man broke into the girl's home three times, assaulting her and another man, also of Milton, police said.

The suspect allegedly threatened to kill the girl and her family if she reported the incidents to the police. The girl was also almost hit by a car which drove at her recklessly, said police, and at one point was forced into a vehicle.

A 20-year-old man has been charged with three counts of break and enter, three counts of assault, two counts of forcible confinement, as well as threatening death and dangerous driving.

The suspect, whose name has not been released to protect the victim, had been dating the 17-year-old girl.

Elderly couple hurt in crash

An elderly woman steered her family car to safety down the escarpment

after her husband was knocked unconscious in the driver's seat.

Ruby and Fred Childs, 73, of Millside Drive were travelling east on Steeles Avenue at 2 p.m. Sunday when their car collided with a westbound vehicle west of Tremaine Road.

Mr. Childs lost consciousness and

the vehicle continued eastbound. Police said his wife then steered the car to safety until it came to a rest 1 kilometre from where the cars collided.

The couple and the driver of the westbound vehicle were taken to Milton District Hospital with minor injuries. Only Mr. Childs was held overnight. Charged with failing to share the roadway is a 66-year-old Victoria, B.C. man.

The triathlon Mr. Fraser plans for August 29 will begin at 8 a.m. rather than the customary 9 a.m. to have the initial bicycling stage completed earlier in the morning, probably shortly after 10 a.m. Mr. Fraser will also tell course marshalls to get cars through gaps in the bike racers whenever possible.

The race organizer pointed out the positive economic spinoffs for Mil-

ton, noting that 10,000 people had visited the community since the sport took hold here in the mid 1980s. The races, featuring as many as 700 competitors, have received coverage in triathlon magazines and on network television, he added.

Ms Howard said it would help the image of cyclists in general if other riders, not associated with Mr. Fraser's events, "were more mannerly and appropriately behaved," when they used Milton's picturesque rural roads for an outing.

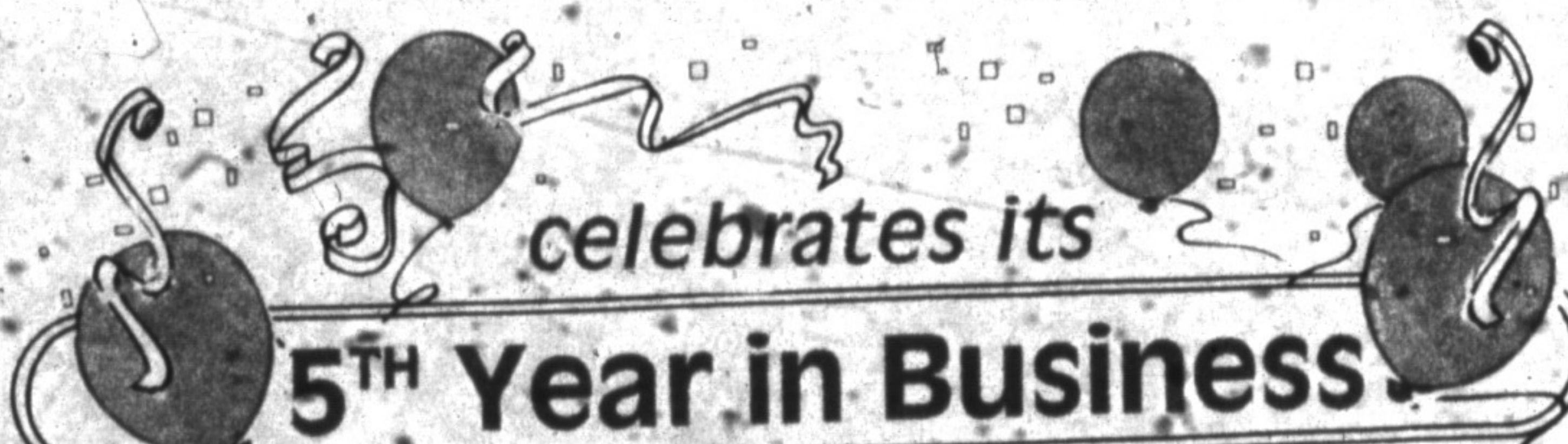
