**Rash of thefts
from autos**

The Halton Regional Police and Crime Stoppers of Halton are asking for the public's assistance in identifying those persons responsible for a rash of thefts from automobiles in Burlington.

During a 12-day period between July 6 and 18, the City of Burlington experienced a rash of 165 entries to private automobiles.

In most cases, the vehicle's windows were smashed out and a wide range of items were stolen.

The thieves targeted cash and car stereo systems for the most part, but thefts involved television sets, wallets and cellular telephones as well.

Damage caused by just the entry alone costs an average of \$200 for repairs to the windows. This then totals \$33,000. This does not take into account the appraisal value of the property and cash stolen from the cars after the initial damage costs.

As a result we all pay. Insurance costs escalate and law enforcement costs rise as well.

**Rent hikes
stuck at
4.9 per cent**

Landlords will only be able to increase rents by 4.9 per cent in 1993 under new rent control guidelines recently set by the Ministry of Housing.

The 4.9 per cent guideline is the first to be calculated under the new Rent Control Act, and is a reduction from the 1992 guideline of 6 per cent.

The guideline is the amount by which a landlord can increase the rent for a unit per year. Most Ontario tenants receive a rent increase no greater than the guideline.

In some cases, landlords may ask for an increase of up to 3 per cent above the guideline for necessary, legitimate repairs or for high increases in utilities or property taxes.

To receive an above-guideline increase, a landlord must justify the costs at a rent control hearing.
