Hanley finishes second on hometown track

Randy MacDonald found Scotia Speedworld's outside groove to his liking last week en route to a victory in the GM Motorsport 200 American-Canadian Tour series race in Halifax.

The largest crowd in the track's history saw the Oshawa, Ontario resident lead all but 19 circuits of the 200 lap event in capturing his second win of the year and third of his ACT career. The 1990 GM Series champion won the Budweiser 200 at Cayuga Speedway earlier this year.

"I took a chance and went outside," said MacDonald, who was concerned about the difference in traction between the cement and asphalt sections of the turns. A cement strip was laid a month ago through the apex of the turns in the racing groove because the asphalt kept

peeling up. The higher groove, which did not have the problem, is still asphalt.

"I wasn't expecting the traction to be as good as it was on the outside. I think Ralph (Nason) was surprised to see me out there. The car just stuck and that was probably the key to my win. I made my move early, using the corner when I wanted and never got stuck on the outside on a restart," MacDonald added.

Rookie of the Year contender Kim

Wallace started on the pole, his first of the year, but Nason wrestled the lead from the freshman runner on the first circuit. MacDonald, who started fourth on the grid was able to get by Nason on the 16th lap, but the Chrysler LeBaron driver returned the favour on lap 21. The pair were the only competitors to lead the race, with MacDonald gaining the advantage for the final time on lap 76.

Finishing second to MacDonald was current ACT and GM National

stock car series point leader Junior Hanley of Campbellville. Hanley grew up in Nova Scotia and was cheered wildly in the winner's circle.

"My car worked really well on the outside early in the race, but after one of the cautions, I couldn't stay out there. I had to try to go under people to improve my position," Hanley said. His second place position allowed him to retain both series point leads.
