Leading the way for the winners was Michael Fratarcangeli, Derek Hickey and Julian Ricci with three hits apiece. Top hitters

for the losers was Robert Petherick.

The Senior T-Ball finale was an exciting affair with Doublerinks squeaking out a 21-20 victory over Bank of Montreal.

Doublerink Arenas senior boys T-Ball squad concluded a successful first-place season which included two wins and one loss by winning all of their playoff games.

The semi-final game on August 9 featured second place Bank of Montreal against fifth place Belamy's. The Belamy Bats were silent on this day and Bank of Montreal cruised to an easy win on their way to the championship game to meet Doublerink Arenas.

In the championship game Bank of Montreal struck early for six runs in the first and four in the second to take a 10-6 lead after two innings. Brendan Baker scored two of the first 10 Bank of Montreal runs.

Great offensive work by Jonathan Webb at third, Lee Johnston at second and Jeff Gaetan at first helped hold the Bankers to just two unearned runs in the top of the 3rd. Doublerink arenas after three quick outs then responded with eight straight hits to score seven runs and take a 13-12 lead after three complete.

The fourth inning saw Bank of Montreal score four runs including Trevor Armstrong third of four runs on the day and Craig Ellison's second of three runs on the day. In the bottom of the fourth Doublerink scored five runs on seven hits which included Aiden Glynn's and Ricky Bannerman's second hits of the game.

The fifth inning started with Doublerink ahead 18-16. Bank of Montreal scored four runs to take a 20-18 lead with Doublerink still to bat. Offensive star Josh Dickson got things started with his fifth hit of the game. Catcher Ben Mayes then singled to put runners at first and second. They were both brought into scoring position by a sacrifice to the right side of the diamond by Bannerman. Dickson then scored his fifth run of the game on a single by Gaetan which moved Mayes to third.

Gaetan went to second when a throw to third was tried. Shortstop Darryl Langstone then came to the plate with the winning run at second base. He more than delivered when he hit a three-run homer to right centre field, to make the final score Doublerink Arenas 22 and Bank of Montreal 20. Good performances were also put in by Doublerink players Mark Roselle, Sean McArthur and most improved player of the year Stewart Douglas.
