

Campbellville's recycling depot has become an ugly issue

The problem of a mess at Campbellville's recycling depot was recycled yet again at municipal council Monday night.

Ward 3 councillor Barry Lee, who represents the area, carried the debate by getting agreement from his colleagues to look at screening the recycling depot in an effort to hide what passersby contend is often an eyesore and a

source of blowing garbage.

But Ward 2 councillor Brad Clements also got a few shots in, saying the recycling depot should be closed anyway since rural residents had recently spurned municipal garbage collection.

As far as the recycling bins go, "they should be taking them out of there," councillor Cle-

ments stressed. Simply improving the appearance of the site amounts to "trying to solve part of the problem."

Rural residents who want to drop off recyclable material should take it to the urban centre on Steeles Avenue or, come November, to the landfill site on Highway 25 slated to open then. "That's it."

If the rural residents want to make some other arrangement, they should "get garbage pick-up" by the Town, Mr. Clements said. Such an alternative was turned down in a recent survey of rural dwellers, who generally dispose of their waste through private haulers.

"I can't agree with that line of thinking at

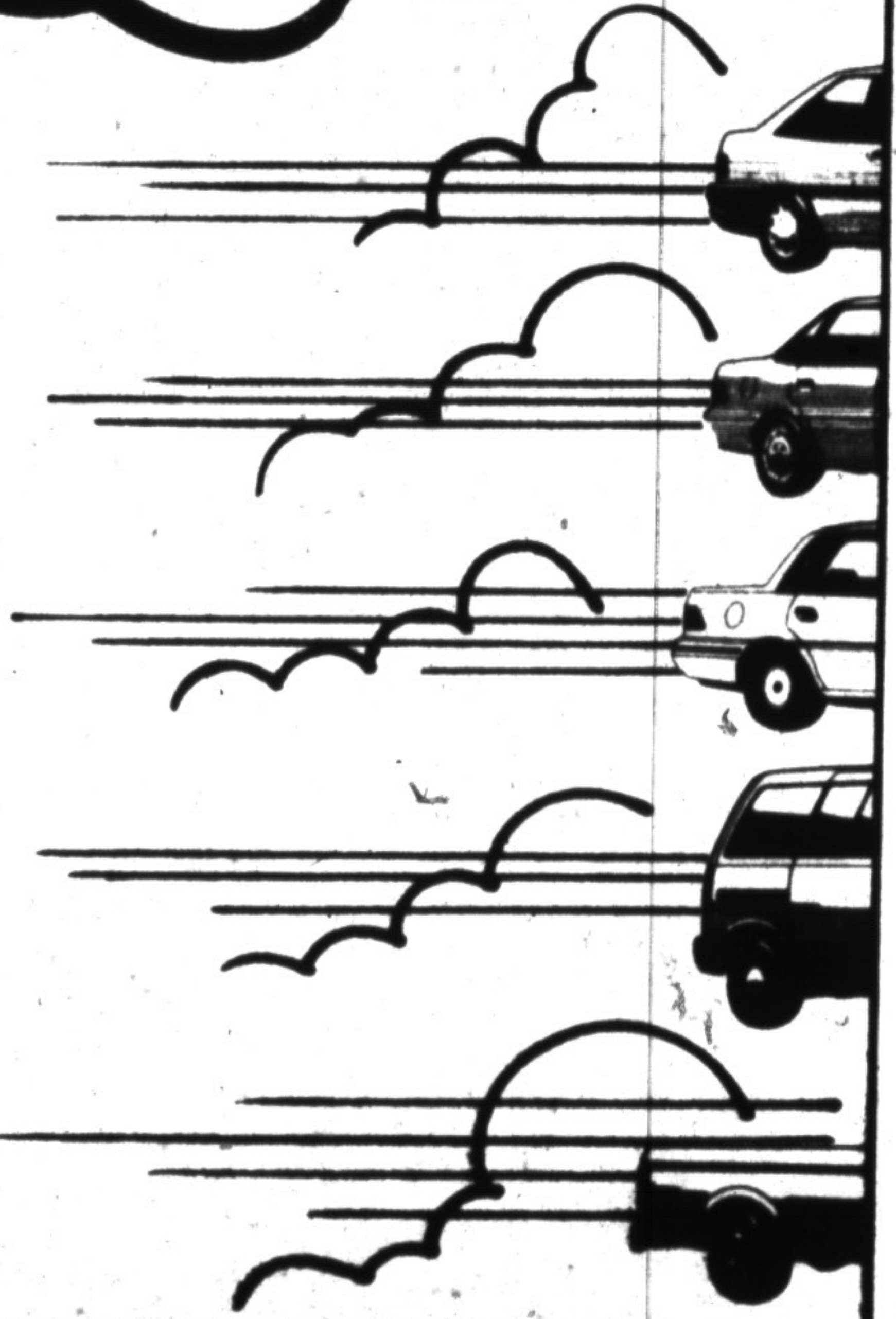
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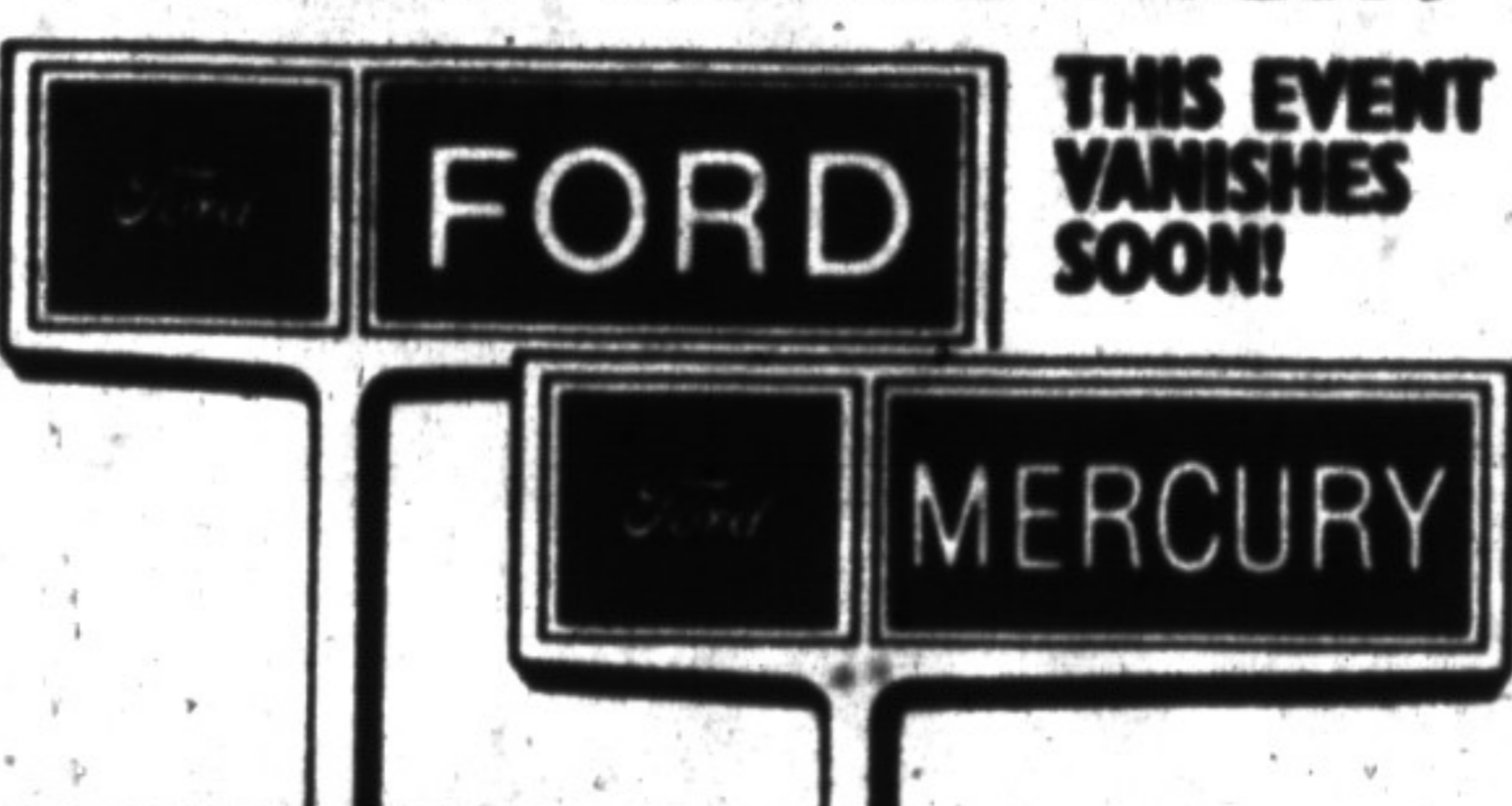
