**'Athletic'
bank robber
sought**

Halton Regional Police, in Burlington and Crime Stoppers of Halton are appealing to the public for information that will lead to the arrest of a lone male who robbed a Royal Bank in Burlington in April, 1992.

At about 1:30 p.m. April 18, an unknown male entered the Royal Bank at 560 Plains Rd. in Burlington. He hopped over the counter and screamed at the teller to open the money drawer. The suspect grabbed a quantity of money from the till and fled the bank on foot in a westerly direction.

The robber is described as white, approximately 5'7", 120 to 160 pounds, aged 18-28 with a young voice. He used obscene language and shouted. The suspect is athletic as he vaulted the counter with ease.

He wore a black nylon hat/stocking mask that covered his entire face and neck, blue track suit with kangaroo jacket with two white stripes circling the sleeves, white runners (possibly Brooks).

**Accident victim
flown to hospital**

A 36-year-old Oakville woman was rushed by air ambulance to a Toronto hospital after seriously injuring her arm in a car accident on Highway 25 Saturday.

A northbound Honda Civic skidded on its left side, flipped over, and landed in the east ditch south of Burnhamthorpe Road at about 4:45 p.m., said the Milton OPP.

The car's windows were smashed in the impact of the single-vehicle accident. Witnesses at the scene said the car swerved onto the shoulder of the road just before the crash.

The driver, the sole occupant of the Honda, was flown by helicopter to Sunnybrook Medical Centre.

The accident is under investigation. No charges have been laid.

Impaired charges

A 36-year-old Fourth Line man faces two drunk driving-related charges after a citizen reported an erratic driver to police.

A witness travelling westbound on Main Street near Court Street spotted a car drive up on the curb twice almost hitting a small child, Halton police said.

The citizen followed the car to the Carriage Square parking lot. A man was later charged with impaired driving and driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood.
