chemotherapy and at one point stopped breathing. But, doctors switched his treatments and the tumours began to shrink. By the age of nine months, Stephen was undergoing break-through laser treatments which destroyed the cancer.

It's too soon to tell, but doctors believe Stephen's sight will be normal, except he may have lost central vision in one eye.

All in all, he's doing well. "Stephen had his first clear check-up on Monday," says his mother with excitement in her voice.
