Former Reform president seeks candidacy of Halton-Peel

Palgrave resident Dick MacDuffee recently stepped down as president of the Reform Party in the Halton-Peel riding to seek the nomination for candidate.

Because he said he believes Canada needs "major changes in Ottawa to change the direction of the country," he decided to join the race with three other Reformers.

Putting an end to "spending money we don't have" is a Reform Party principle he strongly supports, Mr. MacDuffee said.

Equal rules for all Canadian citizens — no special status — is another of his beliefs, he added.

Mr. MacDuffee isn't new to

politics. He represented Caledon as a school trustee for the Peel Board of Education from 1976 to 1985.

He joined the Reform Party in 1990 and was instrumental in forming the riding association for Halton-Peel in May last year when he became president.

Since then, the membership in the riding has grown from 30 at the initial meeting to about 700.

The 59-year-old chose to become a Reformer because, he said, he believes the party "is earnestly striving to elect a new breed of politician who will place country before self."

Mr. MacDuffee is currently president of houseware manufacturing company Sun-Glo Household Products Inc., which he founded in

Bolton in 1979.

Prior to Sun-Glo, he held senior management positions in sales and marketing with Bristol Myers, AGF Management, and IBM.

A 19-year resident of the Palgrave area, Mr. MacDuffee is married and has four children. He holds an honours bachelor of arts in business administration from the University of Western Ontario.

Members of the Reform Party's Halton-Peel riding association will choose their candidate at a nomination meeting in Georgetown Oct. 14.
