"It's been very encouraging," says Janice Garrod, president of MPAC. "We have sold more than twice as many tickets as we had at this time last year, and we haven't even begun to advertise yet."

The success of this season's series is particularly satisfying to MPAC, seeing as the future of the organization was very much up in the air last year.

"A lot of our original members were leaving us to move on to other things, and we were not sure we could continue without some new blood," says Barb Bangay, former president of MPAC.

"It would have been very disappointing to have to call it quits after seven years."

But a call for volunteers at last year's concerts successfully recruited several new members, which along with the rapid sale of this year's tickets has left the members of Milton Performing Arts for Children feeling positive.

"It's obvious that families in Milton really want us to continue our work, and that's very gratifying," says Ms Bangay. Of course, new members are always welcome to join this enthusiastic group of volunteers.
