

Get to know Milton's community information service this week

This is the week to get to know Information Milton, a community information and referral service which has been operating since 1987.

It's Community Information Week in Ontario and staff at Information Milton are encouraging residents to become aware of the service and to use it if they haven't already.

Information Milton is located in the bottom level of the Optimist Centre, 311 Commendial St. It's part of Milton Community and Information Services, an umbrella organization which provides office space to

various social service agencies and houses CHERISH Parent/Child Centre, a toy library, a housing registry service and private home day care program.

Most residents who have used the services of Information Milton do so by telephone. Hundreds of in-

quiries are handled annually. Information provided in- is \$15 and appointments must be made. Clinics are open cludes government agencies, public or volunteer organizations including counselling agencies, service agencies, community and sports groups.

Staff draw from a huge date base and have access to information from other communities thanks to modern technology. In addition to sharing information with callers, Information Milton provides listings for Milton Alive community guide published each spring by The Champion and to Milton Chamber of Commerce for its business directory's community section.

Information Milton is currently working to expand public access to its data base in a cooperative venture with Milton Public Library.

It is hoped computers will be in place by early 1993 which would provide public access to information during library hours.

Information Milton coordinates the postings on the Town of Milton sign at the corner of Ontario and Main streets. This sign is available to community groups to promote coming events. Even if the sign is already booked for a time a group requests its use, the informa-

tion about that coming event will be included in Information Milton's community calendar and will be passed on to callers.

A project Information Milton kicked off with great success are regular foot care clinics provided by the Victorian Order of Nurses. Cost


