All aboard for Fall Extravaganza

Mother nature will provide the scenery and the Halton Radial Railway Museum will provide the transportation during the annual 'Fall Extravaganza' on Sunday.

On display will be the first two Toronto Transit Commission Red Toronto Subway cars, one of which was the first car that carried passengers into the Toronto Union Station on March 30, 1954.

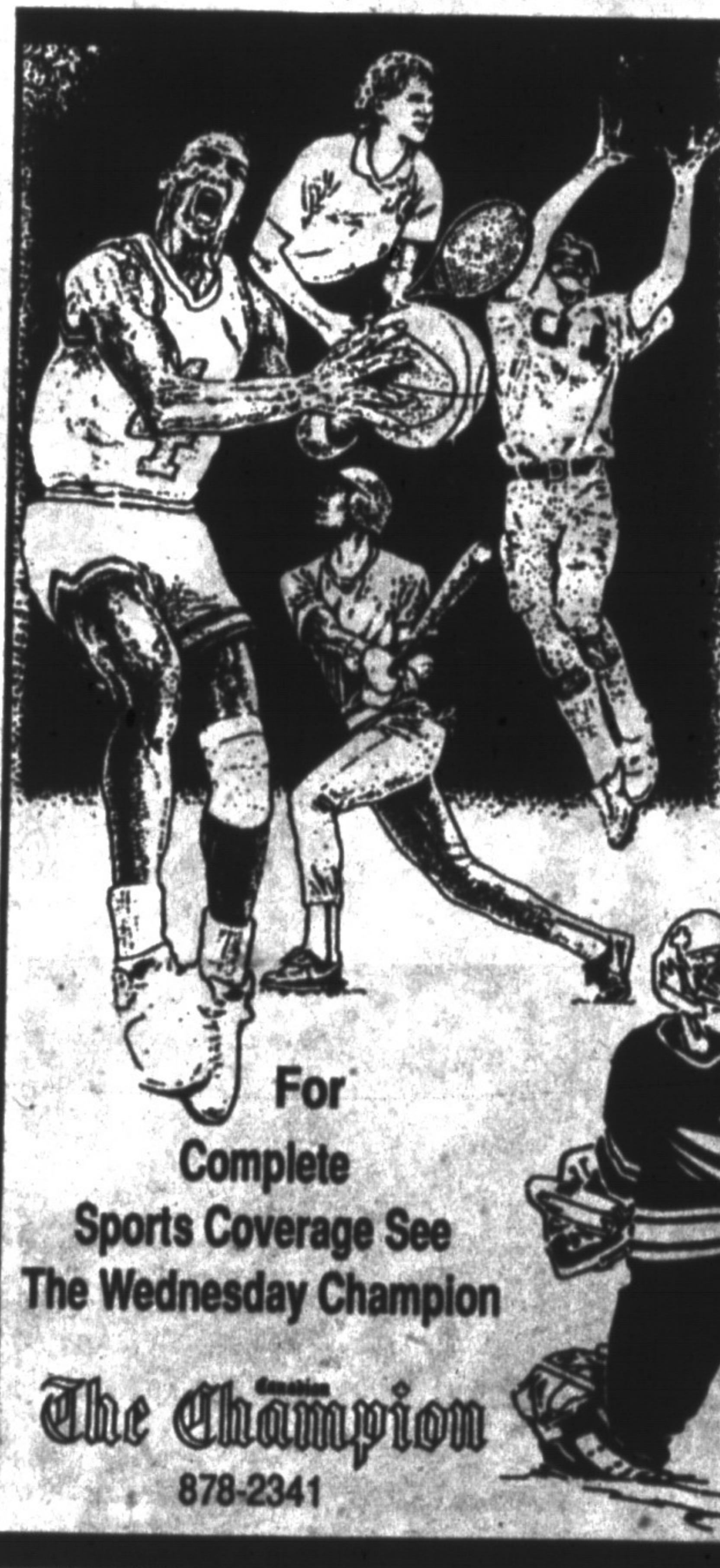
