

Original art featured at fourth annual show Oct. 2-3

Fine art will again be the focus of the Fourth Annual Nassagaweya Art Show and Sale October 2 and 3 at the Brookville Community Centre on Guelph Line.

The show opens Friday and runs from 4 to 9 p.m. and on Saturday from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Opening ceremonies and awards to artists will begin at 4:30 p.m. Friday.

"The show will include fine art in

all price ranges and in a variety of mediums," explained chairperson Betty Bassett. "The number of artists applying and the exceptional quality of the work meant the selection committee was faced with difficult choices. However it is also encouraging to see how this annual exhibit is growing in both size and reputation," she added.

The show and sale traditionally

features work in the mediums of oil, watercolour, acrylic, ink, calligraphy, sculpture and dry brush. Prices are as varied as the pieces for sale.

Organizers say the show is "an excellent opportunity to discover very good original art at affordable prices".

A student art display, a popular addition to last year's show, will be


repeated and will feature artist Tina Newlove of Campbellville and other budding artists submitted by Halton area schools.

Artists will receive awards including: best of show; best booth; awards of merit; and people's choice awards by dignitaries and celebrities attending the show. Those who attend the show will have a chance to purchase tickets for the annual United Church Women draw.

Artisans from the area have

provided samples of their work as door prizes. The locations of many of their workshops and studios will be included in the art show catalogue.

Admission costs \$2. Both the art show and draw are sponsored by the Ebenezer United Church Women in support of the new addition recently constructed for church and community use. Funds are being raised for the elevator and handicap access currently being installed.

Works of Halton artists on display in juried art show

Artists from across Halton can have their works included in the Here and Now 1992 juried art exhibition at the Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre.

As many as three works may be submitted in the categories of painting, fibre, drawing, photography mixed media and three dimensional work. All pieces must be original works completed in the last 12 months.

Prizes will be presented at the official opening of the annual exhibition on Wednesday, Oct. 14 from 7-9 p.m. Entries must be submitted on Tuesday, Oct. 6 between 2-8 p.m. The exhibition will continue until November 1.

All submitted works must be for sale and a 25 per cent commission on each work sold during the show will be taken.

The members of the jury are: McKay Houston, painter; John Mattas, painter/sculptor; Margaret Squire, painter.

There's a nonrefundable entry and handling fee of \$5 for each work which must be paid when entries are brought to the Cultural Centre.

All entries must be suitably framed or otherwise prepared for display and must include a card stating the artist's name, address, phone number as well as the title and medium of the work and the retail sales value.
