Since 1984 The Breeders Crown has encompassed the entire North American continent and reflected the ambiance and local flavor of each of the 26 host tracks.

Mohawk's country oval has previously hosted four separate Breeders Crown events including the 1984. Two Year Old Filly Trot won by Conifer; the 1985 Three Year Old Colt Trot won by eventual Horse Of The Year Prakas; the 1987 Two Year Old Colt Trot won by Hall of Famer Howard Beissinger and Defiant One, and the 1988 Three Year Old Colt Pace, won by two-time divisional champion Camtastic.

The world's champion horses and drivers will test their speed, endurance and durability with one ultimate goal to win a prestigious Breeders Crown title. Their talents trotting horses shapes up as a two winner of 19 crowns and \$6.8 milwill be extended to the limit in four divisional championships with purse money of more than \$1.4 million.

The lion-hearted Falcon Seelster mare, Shady Daisy is the star attraction in the \$306,750 Breeders Crown for pacing mares. Shady Daisy is no stranger to the OJC circuit, having won the Roses Are Red Stakes at Greenwood this past summer and following up at Mohawk with a 1:53 win in the \$100,000 Milton Stakes, preceded by a track record 1:52.3 effort one week earlier.

A win in the \$368,100 event for pacing horses would secure Horse Of The Year honours for the amaz+ ing Artplace, who has been invincible on the racetrack this season, A field of eight elite trotters will "winning all 14 starts and boasting a career bankroll of \$2.8 million. His stablemates, Odds Against and '91 Crown winner Camback, who recently time-trialled in 1:48.4 will compete against him.
