## Hitch a ride to Pearson

There's a new way to get to Pearson International Airport from Milton.

Airways Transit will be making regular scheduled stops at the Herigate Inn five times a day — every day. The Toronto Airporter Service landed in Milton yesterday (Tuesday) when it was added to the Hamilton-based company's route from Kitchener to the airport.

After 20 years of operation, Airways has expanded into Milton. Its Burlington and Oakville customers get door-to-door service while in Kitchener, Waterloo and Cambridge both door-to-door and 'airporter' service are available.

A van — or as many as necessary — will depart from the Herigate at 7:20 a.m. (arrive 8 a.m.); 12 noon (arrive 12:30 p.m.); 2:15 p.m. (arrive 2:45 p.m.); 4:45 p.m. (arrive 5:15 p.m.) and 7:45 p.m. (arrive 8:15 p.m.). The service is scheduled to arrive in Milton a half hour after leaving the airport at 8:15 a.m.; 1:30 p.m.; 3:15 p.m.; 6:15 p.m. and 10 p.m.

Riders are required to make advance reservations. Bill Moore, director of public relations and marketing for Airways Transit Service Ltd. says local travel agents have been informed about the 'airporter'. He's counting on their referrals to bump-start the company's expanded service.

Customers will be allowed to park free of charge at the Herigate Inn, where Airways Transit schedules are also available.

The adult fare is \$18.75 and the children's fee is \$9.50 (one way).

Mr. Moore explains the company's drivers are familiar with "back roads and in roads", making major delays rare. The vans are equipped with a two-way radio and access to traffic reports.

Passengers are dropped off at their respective terminals and when returning to the airport are to report to the ground transit desk at the arrivals level. The driver meets the customer at the booth. Again, the return trip must be booked in advance.

One of the advantages of the airporter service, Mr. Moore points out is the drivers also handle the luggage.

According to the company's marketing director, about 70 per cent of Airways Transit clients are travelling for business. Vacationers represent the balance of the clientele.

### In the ballpark

What does Mister C's Donuts & More and the SkyDome have in common? The answer is soft ballpark pretzels.

Previously an American import, along with the game they are associated with, the ballpark pretzels are now made in Canada by an offshoot company of Mister C's. The founders of the chain of donut shops, Sidney Feder and Marty Cohen began wholesaling the soft pretzels nationally in May through Meadowpine Foods.

According to local store owner Ghulam Chishty, the "fat free" pretzels are a hit in town, especially with the senior citizens who live in the neighbourhood of his store at 88 Ontario St.
