Town lays off first employee in 25 years

The municipality will lay off one fulltime public works employee and let two temporary ones go now that garbage collection will be done by the private sector.

Town public works director John Matthews made the announcement Tuesday. In effect, it means the Town will save \$80,000 a year, Mr. Matthews said — about 1 per cent of the municipal tax levy.

Five Town workers collect garbage, the two temporary ones and three fulltimers. The remaining two fulltimers will be re-assigned to other duties, Mr. Matthews said.

"We're not happy seeing any union member laid off," said Bruce Fendley, shop steward for Local 636 of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, the

union representing the 25 municipal public works employees. "We didn't want to see anybody go."

In his 15 years with the municipality, "it's the first time the Town ever had a layoff," Mr. Fendley said.

"We weren't happy but we're glad we're losing only one (fulltime person). You hate seeing anybody laid off, but one is better than three."

Browning Ferris Industries (BFI) is scheduled to begin collecting Milton garbage in January of 1993. The company has a three-year contract, and is charging Milton \$227,945 for the service next year.

Mr. Matthews said the Town had budgeted \$360,000 for garbage collection in 1993, which would have included the salaries of the five employees involved.
