

Region tells us to get out and vote

Wednesday Halton regional council passed a motion urging people to get out and vote in the referendum Monday, but stopped short of actually debating the merits of the Yes and No positions.

A motion put forward by Oakville councillor Stephen Sparing to raise the question of voting Yes or No was defeated, just after council unanimously passed one calling on people to vote.

Burlington councillor Tony Whitworth said it would be "arrogant" and "carrying our responsibilities too far" to debate the merits of the referendum question.

"I can't agree," rebutted Burlington councillor Ralph Scholtens. In terms of helping people make up their minds, "I can't see it being anything but beneficial."

While most councillors balked at debating the referendum issue, they

all backed Oakville Mayor Ann Mulvale when she said she was "most anxious to avoid a third player" in the vote, "that being apathy."

In the 1991 municipal election, only 23 per cent of eligible voters cast their ballots, she said, and while advance polls have indicated a potentially strong turnout for the referendum, she is still worried. "It is vitally important that apathy not prevail."

In casting a ballot, Halton residents will "fulfill their obligations

as citizens" and "be part of the decision making process," she said.

Milton Mayor Gord Krantz concurred. In speaking to constituents, "I am reluctant to tell them how to vote" he said, "but please get out there and vote."

Burlington councillor Bob Brechin had no qualms about telling people how he, at least, planned to vote. "I think it is presumptuous for an imperfect people to expect a perfect Constitution. I intend to vote yes."

NOTICE TO HALTON RESIDENTS AND HALTON AGREEMENT FOREST USERS

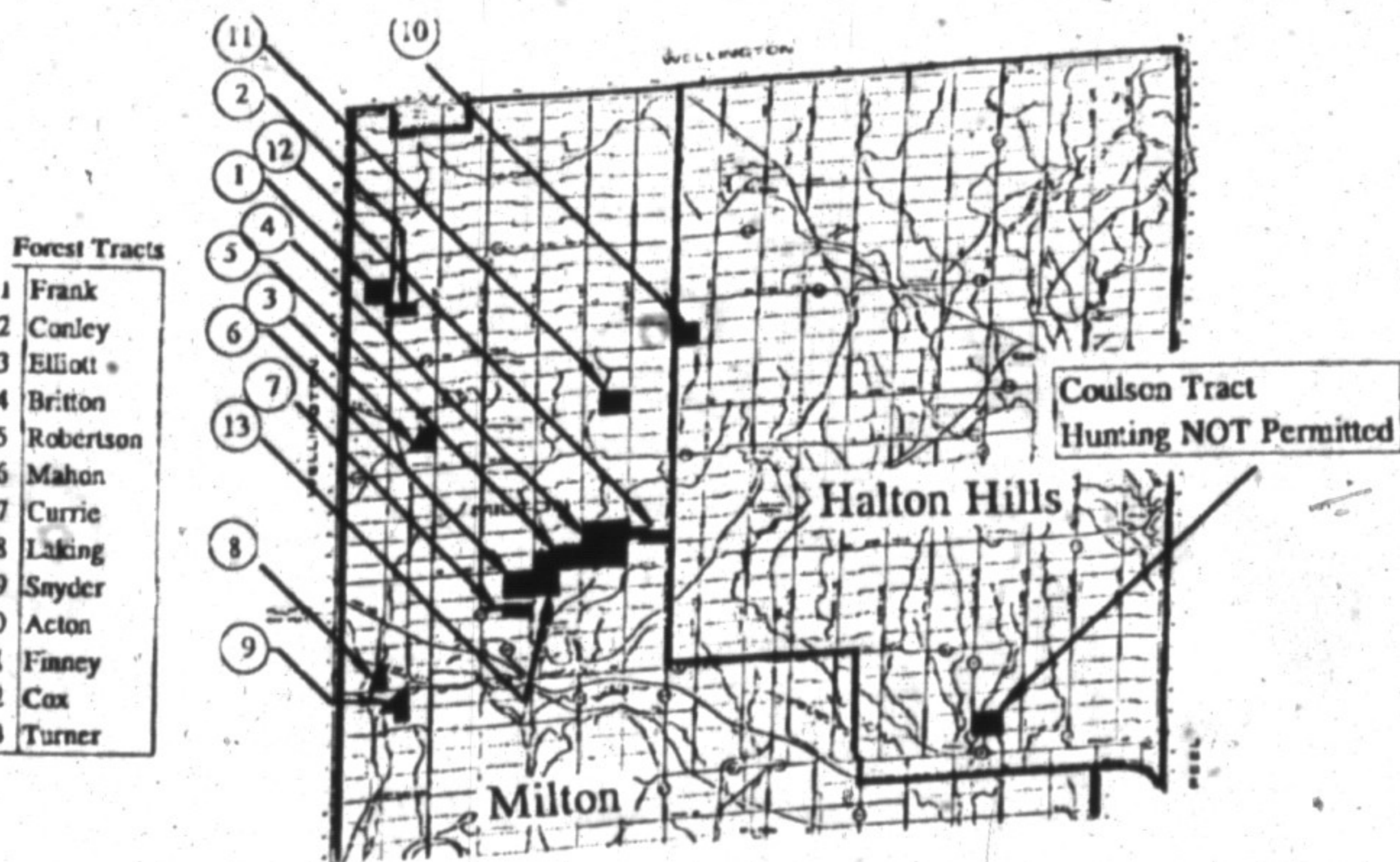
Described below are the periods when certain hunting and discharge of firearm activities are permitted within Halton Agreement Forests, except the Coulson Tract.

Beginning October 15, 1992, through November 1, 1992 and from November 7, 1992 through December 31, 1992, inclusive, ARCHERY HUNTING will be permitted for deer and other small game (if in season).

Beginning November 2, 1992 and continuing through November 6, 1992, SHOTGUN HUNTING will be permitted for deer and other small game if in season. On these five days archery hunting is not permitted in the Agreement Forests.

Regional Council has CONTINUED the ban on hunting and the discharge of firearms within the Coulson Tract Agreement Forest (Part Lot 2, Concession 8, Town of Halton Hills).

All users of the Agreement Forests do so at their own risk and are advised to use caution during the times that hunting activity is permitted. In the event of an emergency, please call Halton Police Services at 878-5511 (north) and 825-4777 (south).
