A refurbished patio and new outdoor furniture at Milton District Hospital will preserve the memory of the late Sandra Logie.

The Kinsmen Club of Milton provided the face-lift for the second floor patio at the hospital and dedicated the project to Mrs. Logie who died in June. Her husband, Kinsmen member Tom Logie, noticed the poor condition of the patio during his frequent visits to the hospital during her illness.

Mrs. Logie was a Kinette for more than 27 years.


