

# Boys jumped by youths after high school dance

An 18-year-old Milton youth has been charged with assault and breach of probation following an incident at a Bishop Reding Secondary School dance held earlier this month, according to Halton police.

On Friday, Oct. 16 at 11 p.m., two 16-year-old male youths were leaving the school after a dance when they were jumped by between five and seven males.

The boys were then punched in the face by a male youth. The two boys suffered cuts and bruises.

Police found the suspect at the Hard Ball Cafe in Milton last Friday at 10:15 p.m. The suspect was charged with two counts of assault and one count of breach of probation. The male youth will appear in Milton court on Nov. 30.

## Under age drinker

An 18-year-old Milton girl was charged with drinking under age after an argument with her boyfriend Friday evening.

The suspect and her boyfriend, who was driving, were travelling south on Bronte Street around 2:30 p.m. when the two got into an argument. The girl jumped out of the moving vehicle close to Mac's Milk and sustained cuts to her head, knees and elbows.

An employee of Mac's reported the incident to local police and the girl was taken to Milton District Hospital and treated for minor injuries. She was later charged with drinking under age.

## Drunk drivers

Halton police charged a local man with impaired driving early Saturday morning on Ontario Street in town.

The suspect was travelling on Ontario Street when he was stopped by police, who subsequently smelled

alcohol on his breath.

The suspect failed the alert test and was taken into 11 Division where a breathalyzer test showed his alcohol level to be well over the .08 level. He was charged with impaired driving and will appear in Milton court on November 23.

A 36-year-old St. Catharines man was charged with four different driving violations including impaired driving Friday evening while travelling through Milton.

According to police, the man was southbound on Guelph Line in Milton at 11:28 p.m. when his car left the road and he went into a ditch.

Police were called and took the man into 11 Division where he was later charged with impaired driving, driving without a licence, driving without insurance, and driving with wrong licence plates.

His bail hearing was held at Milton court yesterday afternoon.

## Car break-in

According to Milton police, a 1981 AMC Concord was broken into last Friday evening in the parking lot of Belamy's Restaurant on Ontario Street in Milton.

Sometime between 7:15 and 9 p.m., culprit(s) broke into the vehicle, probably using a slim jim, and removed about \$700 of merchandise.

Taken were 50 audio cassettes, a black leather jacket and a case of beer. Police investigations continue.

### Man wanted in break-in

Halton Regional Police detectives in Burlington and Crime Stoppers of Halton are asking for the public's assistance in identifying the man who broke into a private residence, taped the victim's hands, head and legs, and stole a small amount of cash and jewellery.

On May 21 between 1 and 1:10 p.m., a woman, 49, was at her residence on Spruce Avenue in Burlington. She heard a loud crash at her rear door and within moments, a man wearing a black stocking mask confronted her in her bedroom.

The suspect told her to remain quiet and demanded money and guns. He then bound the woman's hand behind her back with tape, and searched her purse and a jewellery box, taking some money and jewellery.

Later, he bound her feet and wrapped her head with tape leaving her nose exposed so that she could breathe.

The victim was freed when her husband returned home from work. The suspect is described as male, 35 to 40 years of age, 6'1" tall and approximately 200 pounds. It's possible the suspect has a slight beard.
