Milton came on strong early but two quick Orangeville goals midway through the first period started this home game on its losing track. The play sagged until the dying minutes of the second when Ventura stole the puck and took it in for a lone score. The third period saw both teams

picking up the pace and trading goals — Melito assisted by Macdonald for Milton. The last four minutes were frantic but Orangeville held Milton's six attackers off for a 3-2 final.

Penalties were the order of the day in a "closely called game" at Ching. Pacing the Milton team to a 5-1 final were Macdonald with a natural hat-trick, the opening goal from Chuchmach and a scoring point shot shortly after by Chris Wulfers.

Milton lost the fifth and sixth games of the young season in back-to-back matches with Erin, the team to beat in the Atom loop this year. In the home game Milton took the lead in shots but lost 5-1. Even though Milton played their best hockey of the year in the return game at Hillsburgh arena, they lost 5-0.
