Remember, we fought for freedom: Vet

You won't hear people telling war stories during a typical afternoon at the legion.

In fact, the subject rarely comes up in conversation between veterans at the Charles Street hall. Knowing they share the experience of war says it all.

But today — Remembrance Day — vets everywhere are thinking about their fellow soldiers who lost their lives in battle.

"We want people to remember," says Second World War veteran Richard Cairns. "We fought for a reason. People gave their lives for it (freedom). They weren't forced to go."

The 73-year-old native of Kilmarnock, Scotland recalls eagerly volunteering to serve his country at the age of 20.

"I was up in the recruiting office before war was declared," he says from his Kingsleigh Court home.

Mr. Cairns was a corporal in the British air force, serving at bases including Yorkshire and Cornwall, from 1939 to 1945. As an aircraft fitter, he worked on the ground preparing bombers for battle.

Fortunately, all his airmen came

back, he says. "We lost one aircraft, but we never lost a crew member."

Six years after the war ended, Mr. Cairns moved to Canada and continued working in the aviation field as a flight service inspector until retiring at the age of 65.

He's been a resident of Milton since 1955, and an active member of the local branch of the Royal Canadian Legion for the last 13 years. He began as its secretary.

Fellowship at the legion makes being a member worthwhile, he says. The others "have been through the same thing" in either the First World War or Korea.

In Sunday's Remembrance Day Parade through downtown, Mr. Cairns served proudly as sergeant of arms.

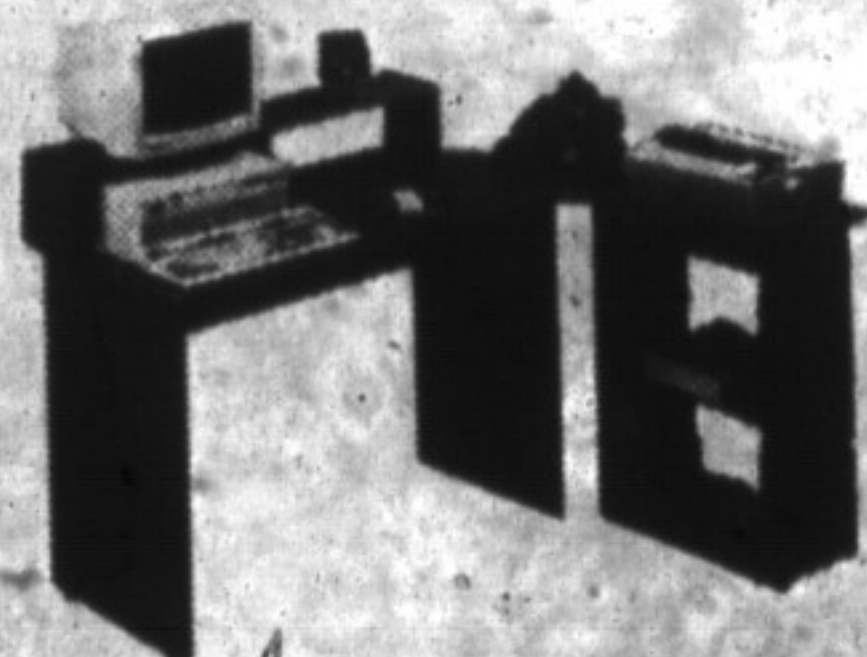

Man faces charges for assault at gas station

A Highway 25 man faces charges in connection with an alleged assault on his common law wife at a Milton gas station.
