The Regional Municipality of Halton is accepting applications from interested citizens to serve on a Committee to advise Regional Council on the operation of its Landfill Site located at 5400 Highway #25 in the Town of Milton.

Applicants should have some familiarity with waste management issues and principles.

Six residents will be appointed to the Halton Waste Management Site Advisory Committee. The Committee will make recommendations for the avoidance or minimization of off-site impacts from the landfill and monitor waste haulage practices. Prospective members must be available to attend evening meetings which are generally scheduled on the third Thursday of each month (8 to 10 meetings per year).

Letters of application, including a description as to how the applicant's background and skills qualify him/her for a position on the Committee, will be received until Friday, November 27, 1992 at 4:00 p.m.
