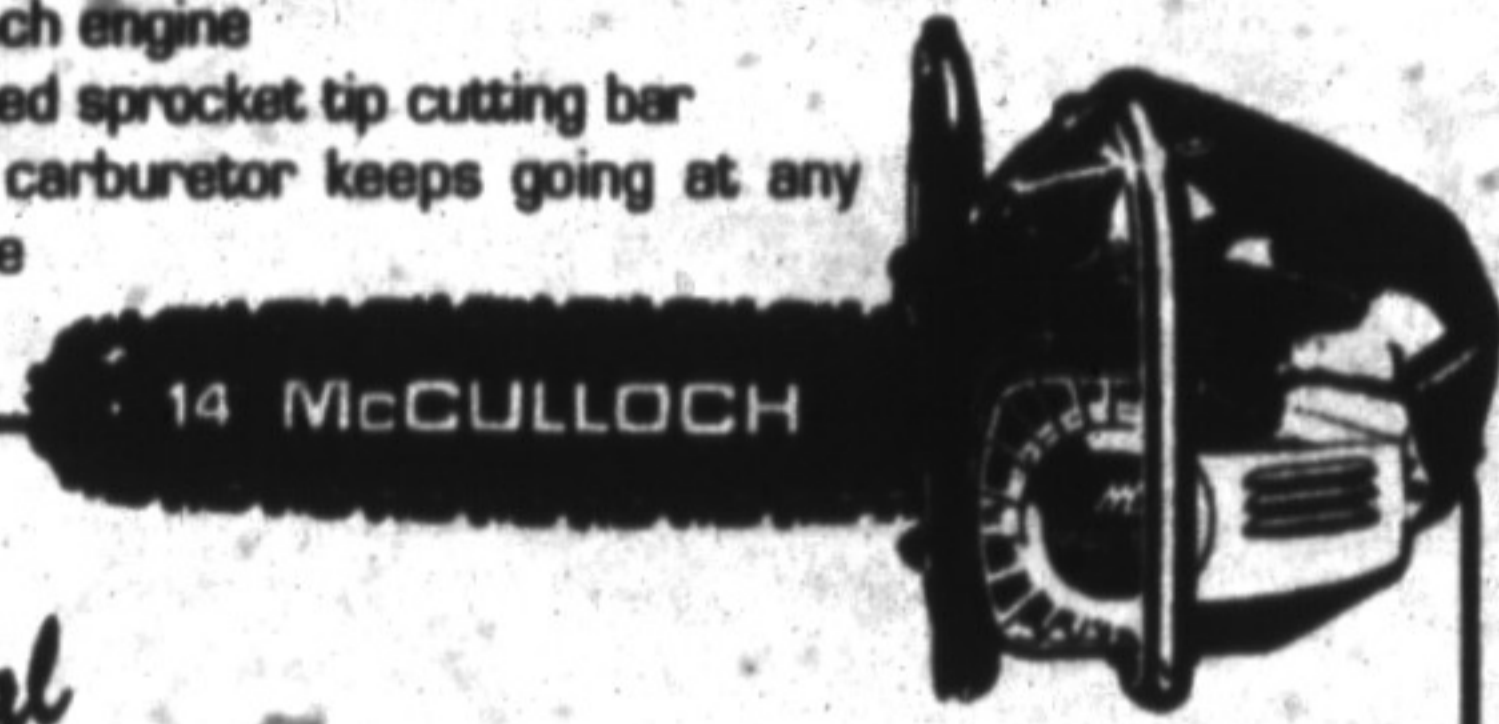

Harness racing moves to Greenwood racetrack tonight

Staying Together had the Midas touch as he got up in the final sixteenth to pace to a one length 1:53.3 victory in the \$50,000 Mohawk Gold Cup for three year olds Sunday Night at Mohawk. Breeders Crown Champion Kingsbridge was second and Bullvons Dream was third.

Driven by Tom Strauss for trainer Jack Parsons and Owner Robert Hamather of Mensall, Staying Together remained near the back of the pack and was five lengths off the lead turning for home.

"I was afraid we weren't going to get there (first)," said Strauss, following the Panarama colt's 18th win in 30 season starts. "This colt doesn't leave the gate really well but the distance doesn't bother him. He can sit out there forever."

Purchased by Hamather for \$19,000 as a yearling, Staying Together has developed into a profitable proposition as he closed his successful sophomore campaign with \$222,362 in earnings.

Staying Together wasn't staked to much this year (except for a couple of events that he was supplemented to) because he didn't show much promise until springtime. Once he made it to the races he blossomed and he hasn't looked back since.

According to Hamather he will be "staked to everything" in '93.

Robert Stewart results

There was no denying Armbo Luxury, a freshman daughter of Dream of Glory in the \$58,700 Final of the Robert Stewart Stakes as she trotted a 2:02.3 effort for driver Dave Wall.

Dancing My Way to post her sixth win in 20 starts while under the care and training of Scott McEneny. The talented miss has \$266,047 banked this season for owner John Grant of Hornby.

Taking over from Lynden Leach past an opening 30.2-second quarter, Armbo Luxury reached the half in 1:02.9, clocked a 1:32.4 three-quarters before coming home in 2:02.3.

"It's a thrill," explained driver Wall, "I have never won this race before and Bob (Stewart) was my best friend. I was confident once I got to the front."

McEneny Praised his trainee for enduring a long season. "She's had a lot of starts for a two year old filly and for her to stay like this is something. She likes being trained and she's better when she gets the work."

Simcha took over from favorite Towners Image past a torrid :27.7 first quarter to pace to a commanding three and a half length 1:55.4 lifetime best performance in the \$77,600 Robert Stewart Stakes for Two Year Old Pacing Fillies.

Driven by Tony Kerwood for trainer Phil Coole and owners Tony Delmonte, C. Sernaglia, G. Piscelli and Don Murray, the Sonsam filly

paced the best mile of her year in defeating Rich N Elegant and Armbo Line.

Simcha now has more than \$160,000 in earnings this season with 5 wins in 15 starts.

"Tim (Twaddle) was trying to open up enough room to let me in the two hole but John (Kopas) wanted that so I had no choice but to keep going," explained Kerwood, "when Tim tipped out at the three quarters I was just hoping I had as much horse as I thought I had. She's a great filly."

According to trainer Phil Coole, Simcha has developed into an awesome filly and is one of the best he's ever trained.

General Brock results

Prince Lee Brisk has come full circle in the General Brock Trotting Series.

The Brisco Hanover trotter finally put all the pieces together for his driver Dan Clements who's been really high on him all along. He benefitted from a second over trip and trotted to a 2:02.3 effort in the \$16,400 final of the General Brock Trotting Series for three year olds. Charisma Seelster was second and My Worthy Champ was third.

In the first leg of the series Prince Lee Brisk got off on the wrong foot as he made a break and finished last at a distance. According to Clements his shoeing was changed after that race, and "he thought he was a pacer that time out."

In the second leg of the series he made a better showing to finish second to My Worthy Champ.
