Also, make sure all lights operate properly and that brakes are adjusted to ensure equal braking.

Fluids also play a role in ensuring the winter health of your vehicle. In addition to checking battery fluid levels, drivers should:

□ Maintain an anti-freeze mix of at least 50/50, which is good for temperatures as low as 40 below zero and should be adequate for most areas.

□ Check engine oil type. Some manufacturers recommend different types winter and summer. Your owner's manual provides you with manufacturers recommendations.

□ Maintain an adequate supply of

windshield-washer fluid for removing salt and other substances used to combat ice. Don't rely on water — it freezes. And replace wiper blades that streak the windshield.

Pay close attention to tire pressure. Air contracts in cold weather, and tires tend to run low in winter, Mr. Congdon says. Be sure tires have appropriate tread. All-season tires are a good choice for snowy areas. And don't forget to check the spare.

Finally, a winter driving kit could prove invaluable in an emergency. Carry in your car such items as a snow shovel, booster cables, ice scraper, snow brush, flares, a small bag of sand or salt, flashlight, paper towels, blanket, a bag of chocolate and extra clothing.

One last reminder: Keep a spare key in a magnetic box under the car. You don't want to be stranded — and locked out — in the cold.
