Notice of Submission GO Transit has completed an environmental study report for the proposed expansion of its rail service between Toronto and Milton to all-day and weekend frequency.

The environmental assessment study, following the process set out by the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, determined that no single aspect or combination of activities of this expansion will result in any significant impact on the environment.

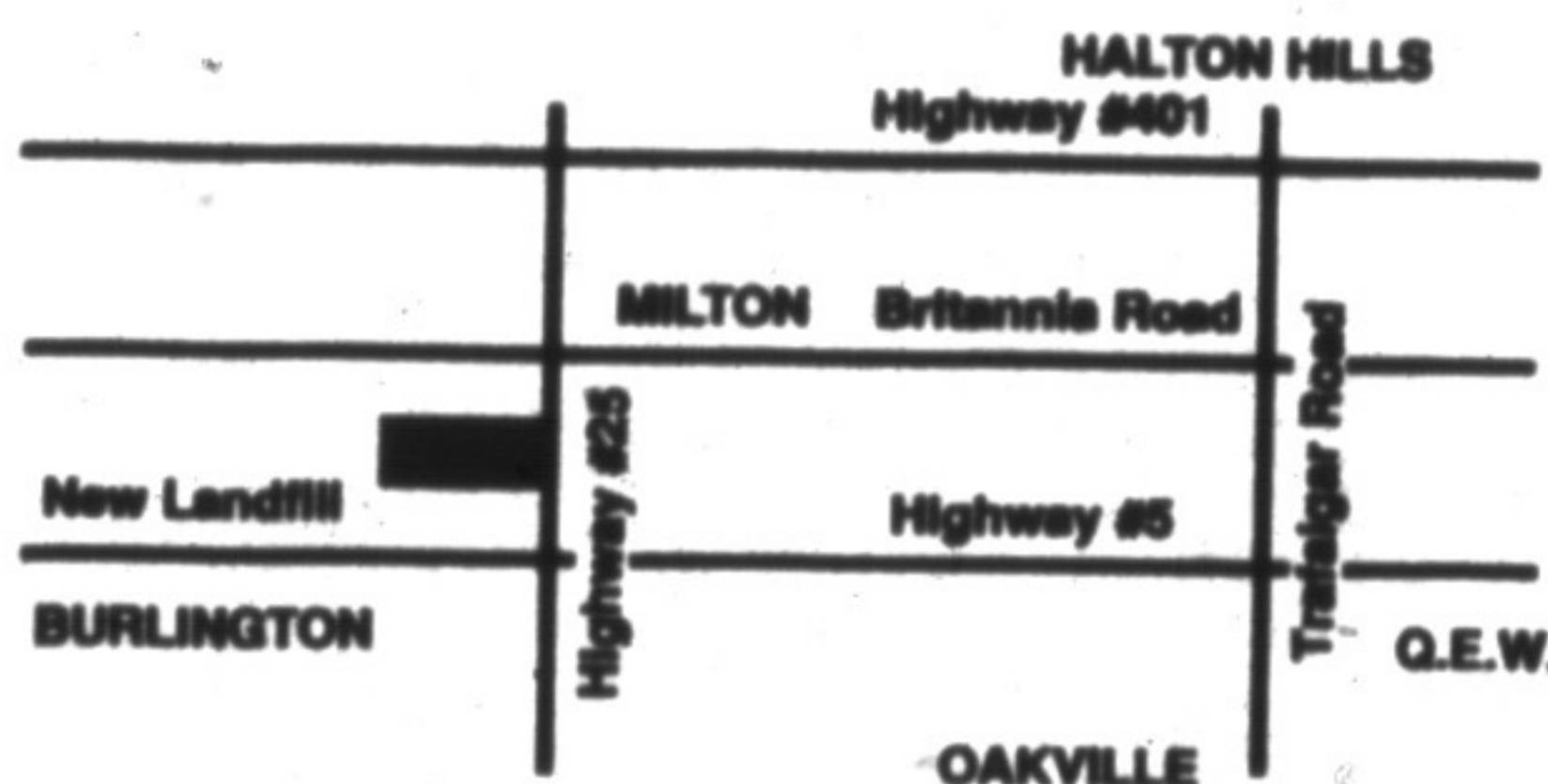

Loads under 150 kg (330 lbs.) are free of charge at the Landfill's Container Station. Loads in excess of 150 kg will be charged at a rate of \$150/tonne.

The **PRIVATE** Container Facilities at Norjohn Transfer Station in Burlington and Leferink Transfer Station in Halton Hills will remain open to the public on a user fee basis. Fees and operating hours will be posted at these facilities.

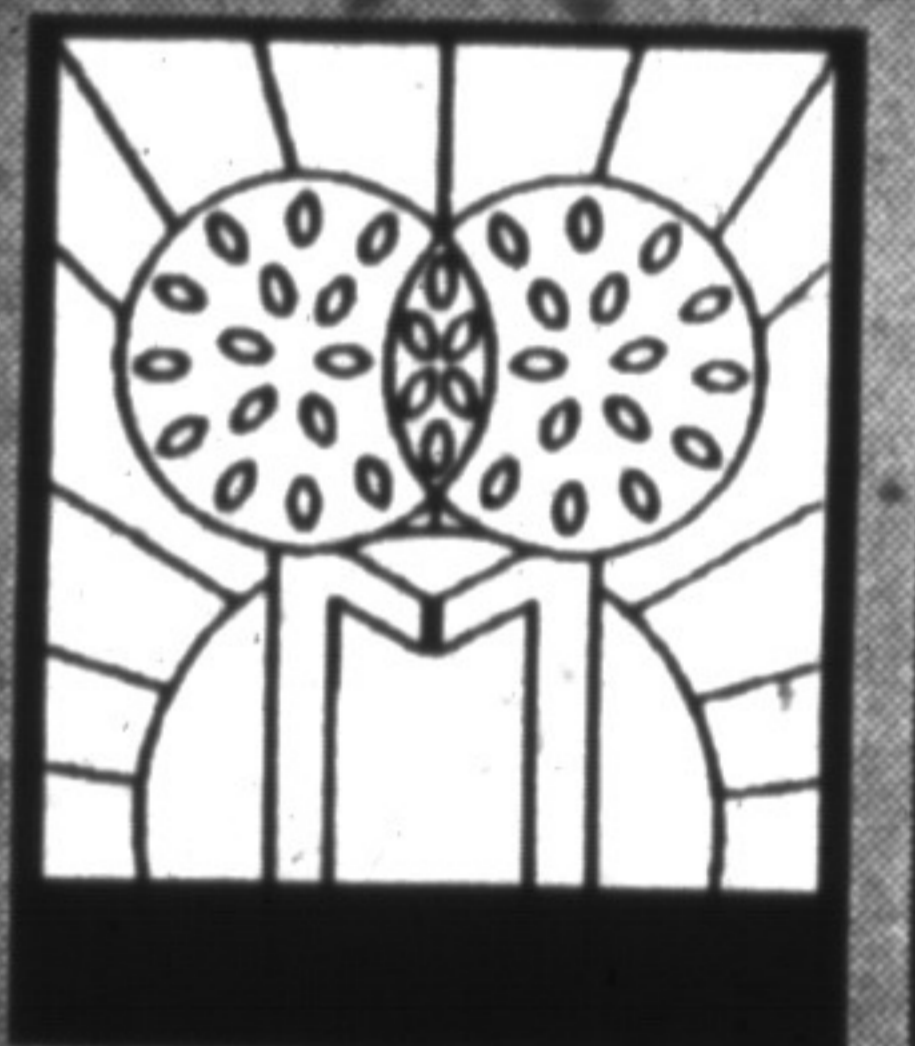
